Electrolysis Council Business:

Tab 1 – Rule 64B8-56.004, FAC – Other Requirements for Electrolysis Training Program Approval

Mr. Tellechea explained the history for this rule and reminded the Committee the Board was planning on doing a complete rule review of the Electrology rules in October.

The Committee recommends taking no action on this rule at this time as it will be included in the rule review.

Dietetic-Nutrition Business:

Tab 2 – Rule 64B8-41.001, FAC – Fees

Mr. Tellechea explained the Council was rewording the rule to be more consistent with other rules. He stated the fee to reactivate a delinquent license is still \$100.

The Committee recommends approval of this rule.

Tab 3 – Rule 64B8-40.003, FAC – Delegation of Powers and Duties

Mr. Tellechea explained that certain duties are delegated to the Council to handle instead of the Board who has oversight for the Council. He expressed concern of a rule that

would have Petitions for Waiver/Variance going through the Council based on the 90 day requirements for Petitions for Waiver/ Variance. He stated to avoid having to issue a license to an applicant that might otherwise not receive a license due to not meeting the 90 day requirement, it would be more appropriate to allow those petitions be presented before the Board.

The Committee agreed and recommends rejecting this rule proposal.

Tab 4 – Rule 64B8-42.002(3), FAC – Licensure by Examination

Mr. Tellechea explained the Council was setting forth the requirements for licensure as a Dietetic-Nutritionist by examination.

The Committee recommends approval of the proposed rule.

Tab 5 – Final Order on Declaratory Statement Request (Natalia L. Cava)

Mr. Tellechea explained that in order to be able to petition for a declaratory statement, the petitioner must have a unique situation that is unique to that individual. He stated this particular petition is not unique to the individual and is general in applicability.

The Committee recommends declining to issue a declaratory statement.
