DIETETICS & NUTRITION COUNCIL:

COUNCIL REAPPOINTMENTS

Tab 1 – Sheah Rarback, MS, RD, LD/N

Mr. Levine introduced the tab. After discussion a motion was made, seconded and carried unanimously to approve Ms. Rarback's application for reappointment to the Dietetics & Nutrition Committee.

ELECTROLYSIS COUNCIL:

Tab 2 – Modification of Rule 64B8-51.006(3)–(6), F.A.C. – Rule Governing Licensure & Inspection of EO Facilities

Mr. Tellechea gave a brief summary of the proposed rule change. After discussion, a motion was made, seconded and carried unanimously to approve the proposed rule language.

Mr. Tellechea asked the committee if they believed that the proposed rule amendments would have an adverse impact on small business or whether the amendment was likely to directly or indirectly increase regulatory costs to any entity (including government) in the excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate in Florida within one year of the implementation of the rule. After discussion, a motion was made, seconded and carried unanimously that there was no such impact.

Action taken: The committee voted to approve the proposed rule language to which there would be no impact on small business

Tab 3 – Modification of Rule 64B8-52.004(3) & (4), F.A.C. – Requirements for Approval of Training Courses for Laser & Light-Based Hair Removal or Reduction

Mr. Tellechea gave a brief summary of the proposed rule change. He raised concerns with the proposed rule language not providing standards/criteria for approving certifying agencies.

The Chair recognized Mr. Jon Pellet, Esq, representative of Society for Clinical and Medical Hair Removal, Inc. Mr. Pellet shared concerns with the impact of adding an additional certifying agency to the approved certifying agency list without set standards/criteria for approving such agencies and spoke against the proposed rule change.

The Chair recognized Ms. Judy Adams, President of the Electrology Society of Florida who spoke in favor of the proposed rule change stating that other options should be made available to electrologists beyond the one currently approved agency.

Mr. Tellechea asked the Committee if they wanted to be involved in the development of the standards/criteria for approving certifying agencies. The Committee answered in the negative. A motion was made, seconded and carried unanimously to send the proposed rule language back to the Electrolysis Council for clarification and development of the criteria/standards for approving certifying agencies and to delegate the Electrolysis Council the responsibility for approving such agencies.

Action taken: the Committee voted to send the proposed rule language back to the Electrolysis Council and delegate to the Electrolysis Council the responsibility for approving certifying agencies

Tab 4 – Modification of Rule 64B8-54.002, F.A.C. – Requirements for Inactive or Retired Status License

Mr. Tellechea gave a brief summary of the proposed rule change. After discussion, a motion was made, seconded and carried unanimously to approve the proposed rule language.

Mr. Tellechea asked the committee if they believed that the proposed rule amendments would have an adverse impact on small business or whether the amendment was likely to directly or indirectly increase regulatory costs to any entity (including government) in the excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate in Florida within one year of the implementation of the rule.
