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DISCIPLINARY PROCEEDINGS

INFORMAL HEARING

TAB 1 Lisa Marie Meyer, OT 13163, DOH Case # 2009-20627

Ms. Meyer was present for the meeting and sworn in by the court reporter.

Mr. Mullings and Ms. Banta were recused from this case due to their participation on the Probable Cause Panel.

Ms. Shah summarized the case # 2009-20627 for the Board.

An Administrative Complaint was filed on October 18, 2010 charging Ms. Meyer with violation of Section 468.217(1)(c), and 468.217(1)(b), Florida Statutes (2009) as pursuant to a Medicaid Fraud Investigation and previous two count felony filed in the Circuit Court of Pulaski County, Arkansas, in case number CR-2009-1413, charging Ms. Meyer with Medicaid Fraud and unlawfully, feloniously, failing to complete, and maintain all medical records for billed services

for five (5) years, as required by the Arkansas Medicaid Program. Additionally, the felony information stated that Ms. Meyer was engaged in criminal activity from on or about January 1, 2007 through on or about February 20, 2008. Ms. Meyer pled guilty September 28, 2009 and pursuant to her guilty plea, was sentenced to five years probation, ordered to pay restitution of sixty seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$67,500) and a judgment of twenty two thousand five hundred (\$22,500) to the Arkansas Medicaid Trust Fund. Ms. Meyer has been excluded from participation in all federally funded health care programs, including the Arkansas Medicaid program. The Arkansas State Medical Board revoked Ms. Meyer's OT license and stayed the revocation for a period of one (1) year during which time Ms. Meyer is to successfully complete probation, pay costs of seven hundred ninety five dollars (\$795.00), and reappear before the Arkansas State Medical Board prior to resuming active practice of occupational therapy, and get the Arkansas State Medical Board's approval of her proposed practice setting in the State of Arkansas.

Pursuant to the Administrative Complaint, Ms. Meyer is charged with the following violations

Count I: Section 468.217(1)(c), Florida Statutes (2009), being convicted or found guilty, regardless of adjudication, of a crime in any jurisdiction which directly relates to the practice of occupational therapy or to the ability to practice occupational therapy, constituting grounds for disciplinary action by the Board of Occupational Therapy.

Count II: Section 468.217(1)(c), Florida Statutes (2009), having a license to practice occupational therapy revoked, suspended, or otherwise acted against, including the denial of licensure, by the licensing authority of another state, territory, or country constituting grounds for disciplinary action by the Board of Occupational Therapy.

Ms. Meyer has not disputed the allegations as set forth in the Administrative Complaint and the case was presented as a Hearing Not Involving Disputed Issues of Material Fact, which requires the Board to impose discipline upon Ms. Meyer's license as deemed appropriate by the Board deems appropriated, and to assess costs of the investigation.

MOTION: Ms. Watson made a motion to make a finding that the Respondent was properly served with the Administrative Complaint. Mr. Hicks seconded the motion, which carried 4/0.

MOTION: Ms. Dunbar made a motion to adopt the findings of fact as set forth in the Administrative Complaint. Mr. Hicks seconded the motion, which carried 4/0.

MOTION: Mr. Hicks made a motion to adopt the allegations of law as the conclusions of law as set forth in the Administrative Complaint and find that this constitutes a violation of the Board of Occupational Therapy Practice Act. Ms. Watson seconded the motion, which carried 4/0.

MOTION: Mr. Hicks made a motion to accept the materials under Tab 1 into evidence for the purpose of imposing penalties. Ms. Watson seconded the motion, which carried 4/0.

The Board discussed and chose not to impose any additional fines, as recommended in the Board's Disciplinary guidelines, due to mitigating circumstances of substantial fines previously imposed in Arkansas.

Mr. Hicks made a motion to impose a Reprimand, no fines, no probation. The motion failed and Mr. Hicks withdrew his motion.

Ms. Dunbar suggested Ms. Meyer to take continuing education courses in the area of time management and documentation to improve such skills.

MOTION: After discussion, Ms. Dunbar made a motion to impose the following penalties:

- 6-months probation under the indirect supervision of a licensed OT, PT or SLP or other appropriate person to Compliance Management Unit upon obtaining employment as an OT; Ms. Meyer cannot own her own therapy company; must work for an employer in a position where she is supervised; probation is tolled until supervised employment begins;
- Submit 2 curriculum vitae's for approval of supervisor by the Board Chair;
- Supervisor required to submit monthly reports, however to review, on a weekly basis, a random 50% of licensee's client documentation to ensure the timeliness of entries and scheduling, and also to reconcile billing records with client documentation.

Mr. Hicks seconded the motion, which carried 4/0.

MOTION: Ms. Dunbar made a motion to accept the assessment of costs, totaling \$2567.21 with 365 days to pay, as recommended by the Prosecuting Attorney. Mr. Hicks seconded the motion, which carried 4/0.

INFORMAL HEARING

TAB 2 Lisa Marie Meyer, OT 13163, DOH Case # 2010-02593

Mr. Mullings and Ms. Banta were recused from this case due to their participation on the Probable Cause Panel.

Ms. Shah summarized the case for the Board and recommended to dismiss the case due to the inconsistency between the use of the word "termination" in s.456.0635, F.S., with the federal use of the term "exclusion" as it pertains to a licensee being unable to bill Medicaid or Medicare for services rendered.

MOTION: After discussion, Ms. Dunbar moved to accept the prosecuting attorney's recommendation to dismiss this case. Mr. Hicks seconded the motion, which carried 4/0.

MOTION: Ms. Watson moved to accept the Prosecutor's Report and allow her to continue to prosecute cases more than one year old. Ms. Banta seconded the motion, which carried 6/0.

POST- DISCIPLINARY PROCEEDINGS

VOLUNTARY RELINQUISHMENT

TAB 4 Voluntary Relinquishment

Karen Kay Davidson, OTA 4874, DOH Case # 2010-03101

An Administrative Complaint was filed on May 18, 2009, charging Ms. Davidson, OTA 4874 with violation of Section 468.217(1) (q), Florida Statutes (2006), for Malpractice, by failing to practice occupational therapy with a level of care, skill, and treatment which is recognized by a reasonably prudent similar occupational therapist or occupational therapy assistant as being acceptable under similar conditions and circumstances. A Settlement Agreement was approved by the Board at the November 2, 2009 meeting of the Board which included: A Reprimand, A \$1000 fine, and Costs of \$1,712.48.

At the April 11, 2011 Meeting of the Board, Ms. Davidson was charged with the violating Section 468.217(1)(v)F.S.(2009), by failing to comply with a previous Board order requiring payment of a \$1,000 fine and costs of \$1,712.48 by January 18, 2010, due to a violation of Section 468.217(1)(q), FS (2006), for failing to practice occupational therapy with reasonable skill and safety. A new Settlement Agreement was imposed which included: Reprimand, Suspension until payment of past due fine in the amount of \$1000 and costs in the amount of \$1,712.48 related to the prior case; Payment of current case costs in the amount of \$721.88; and Payment of current case fine in the amount of \$500.00 to be paid within 365 days of the filing of the Final Order.

After the Final Order was filed Ms. Davidson submitted a personal request to surrender her license.

MOTION: After Discussion, Ms. Watson moved to accept Ms. Davidson's request for administrative voluntary relinquishment of her OT license, with the understanding that Ms. Davidson will still be required to pay the assessed costs and fines. Ms. Dunbar seconded the motion, which carried 6/0.

REPORTS

TAB 5 Steven Sanford, Case #2066-14494

As requested for follow-up from the last meeting of the Board, Compliance reports for Mr. Sanford were placed on the agenda for the Board's review. In the Board agenda materials, unnoticed until the meeting, Ms. Kayshan's review of the billing records were not included in the

agenda materials. Staff contacted the Compliance Officer, but was unable to retrieve such records. The Board agreed to table the review and requested Staff to investigate the timely receipt of the reports and proceed with information on the October meeting agenda.

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

EXEMPTION APPLICATIONS

TAB 6 O'Shea, Mohana R. OT 8953, Clear/Active

Ms. Mohana O'Shea was present, sworn in by the court reporter and not represented by counsel.

Ms. O'Shea submitted an application for Exemption from Disqualification to seek employment in a health care facility licensed under Chapter 400, Florida Statutes, due to results of a Level II background screening. She requests exemption from disqualification from employment in positions covered by s. 400.512 (Nursing Homes and Related Health Care Facilities) and chapter 435 (Employment Screening) of the Florida Statutes. An exemption provides eligibility for employment despite the presence of a disqualifying offense(s).

The disqualifying offenses indicated in Ms. O'Shea's background screening report were committed in 2004 and 2005, after her original date of licensure of 02/02/99. No records were found where Ms. O'Shea reported such charges to the DEPT or Board. Ms. O'Shea has a Clear/Active Florida license with no discipline history.

Ms. O'Shea's initial application for OT licensure was submitted and she was licensed on 02/02/99. The above charges were committed after her original date of licensure.

MOTION: Following discussion, Ms. Dunbar made a motion to table the consideration for the Exemption until Ms. O'Shea undergoes an evaluation by a licensed mental health professional and submits a letter from the evaluator indicating whether she is ready to return to practice, and capable of working in a high risk area with a vulnerable population. This letter must be on the evaluator's professional letterhead and submitted directly to the Board Office. The Board Chair was delegated authority to review the letter and determine whether the exemption should be granted. If the exemption is granted, staff will notify Board Counsel of need for an order granting the exemption. Ms. Banta seconded the motion, which carried 4/2 with four ayes and two nays from Mr. Mullings and Mr. Hicks.

MOTION: Ms. Dunbar amended her previous motion to include the letter must be received prior to the next meeting of the Board, October 20, 2011, or the exemption would be denied. Staff would notify Board Counsel of need for an order denying exemption. Ms. Banta seconded the motion, which carried 5/1 with a five ayes and one nay by Mr. Mullings.

TAB 7 Vollaire, Sarah Jeanette, OTA 11010, Clear/Active

Ms. Vollaire was not required to attend this meeting but was sent a notice and invitation to appear. Ms. Vollaire responded she was unable to attend and was not present for the meeting.

Ms. Sarah Jeanette Vollaire submitted an application for Exemption from Disqualification to seek employment in a health care facility licensed under Chapter 400, Florida Statutes, due to

results of a Level II background screening. She requests exemption from disqualification from employment in positions covered by s. 400.512 (Nursing Homes and Related Health Care Facilities) and chapter 435 (Employment Screening) of the Florida Statutes. An exemption provides eligibility for employment despite the presence of a disqualifying offense(s).

The disqualifying offense indicated in the background screening report was committed in 2006, before Ms. Vollaire's initial date of licensure, on 07/27/09. Ms. Vollaire did not disclose the charge on her original licensure application. No records were found where Ms. Vollaire has reported such charges to the DEPT or Board. Ms. Vollaire has a Clear/Active Florida license with no discipline history.

Ms. Deborah Troup with the Professional's Resources Network (PRN), was present and sworn in by the court reporter. Ms. Troup stated Ms. Vollaire was currently compliant with a PRN monitoring contract.

MOTION: Following a discussion, Mr. Mullings made a motion to grant Ms. Vollaire's Exemption request. Mr. Hicks seconded the motion, which carried 6/0.

PETITION FOR WAIVER OR VARIANCE

TAB 8 Rule 64B11- 4.001, F.A.C., Use of Prescription Devices Richard W. Robitaille, D.C.

Dr. Robitaille was not present for the meeting, was represented by counsel, Mr. Ed Bayo, however, Ms. Veronica Bayo Clifford was present on Mr. Bayo's behalf. Ms. Clifford was sworn in by the Court Reporter.

Dr. Robitaille petitioned the Board to permit him as a licensed Chiropractic Physician to supervise occupational therapist and occupational therapy assistants when training to use electrical stimulation devices, based on his extensive experience and training in the Use of Prescription Devices, and was approved by the Board at the April 11, 2011 meeting. Dr. Robitaille's original petition included Rule 64B11-4.001 (1) (d), F.A.C. specific for the use of 'electric stimulation'. Mr. Robitaille has presented a second petition to the Board requesting waiver or variance from Rule 64B11-4.001 (2) (d). F.A.C., to supervise occupational therapist and occupational therapy assistants, when training to use 'ultrasound' devices.

MOTION: Following discussion, Mr. Hicks moved to approve Dr. Robitaille's petition. Mr. Mulling's seconded the motion, which carried 6/0.

APPLICANT RATIFICATION LISTS

TAB 9 Endorsement Candidates: Occupational Therapists & Assistants

MOTION: Mr. Mullings moved to approve the ratification list of applicants for licensure, 71 names, including 10 names on an addendum list, totaling 81 names. Ms. Banta seconded the motion, which carried 6/0.

ACTION TAKEN: 81 names ratified for licensure by endorsement.

TAB 10 Examination Candidates: Occupational Therapists & Assistants

MOTION: Mr. Hicks moved to approve for licensure, pending the successful passage of the NBCOT examination, ratification list of applicants for licensure as noted, 110 names, including 17 names on an addendum list, totaling 127 names. Mr. Mullings seconded the motion, which carried 6/0.

ACTION TAKEN: 127 names approved for licensure pending successful exam results.

TAB 11 Continuing Education Provider Applications

MOTION: Ms. Watson moved to approve the 4 continuing education providers, 2 providers offering a Prevention of Medical Errors course, and 0 providers offering a Laws and Rules course as listed for ratification. Ms. Banta seconded the motion, which carried 6/0.

ACTION TAKEN: 4 continuing education provider applications approved, 2 Prevention of Medical Errors courses and 0 Laws and Rules courses approved.

RULES REVIEW AND/OR DEVELOPMENT

TAB 12 Development of Rules Rule 64B11-4.003, F.A.C., Discipline

At the April 11, 2011 meeting the Board tabled this item and requested counsel to prepare some proposed language for the further discussion. Mr. Lewy submitted the following language as a basis for discussion.

64B11-4.003 Standards of Practice; Discipline.

(2) (b) Probation with conditions to include limitations on the type of practice or practice setting, requirement of supervision ~~by a licensee of the Board~~ or monitoring, employer and self reports, periodic appearances before the Board, counseling or participation in the Professionals Resource Network (PRN), payment of administrative fines, and such conditions to assure protection of the public. The licensee may choose any natural person licensed by the Board to be a supervisor or monitor. The supervisor or monitor should ideally provide such services without compensation. However, the licensee may contract with a any adequate for-profit entity or other licensee, if a natural person, for a fee. It is the licensee's full responsibility to pay for any supervision or monitoring services. All potential supervisors or monitors must be approved by the Board before providing services. The Board Chair is delegated the authority to review all potential supervisors or monitors for adequacy.

The Board discussed and included the following revisions, and requested Counsel to revise the language and bring back for the Board's review and approval at the October 10, 2011 meeting.

64B11-4.003 Standards of Practice; Discipline.

(2) (b) Probation with conditions to include limitations on the type of practice or practice setting, requirement of supervision ~~by a licensee of the Board~~ or monitoring, employer and self reports, periodic appearances before the Board, counseling or participation in the Professionals Resource Network (PRN), payment of administrative fines, and such conditions to assure protection of the public. The licensee may choose any natural person licensed by the Board to be a supervisor or monitor. The supervisor or monitor should ideally provide such services without compensation. However, the licensee may contract with any adequate for-profit entity or other licensee, if a natural person, for a fee. It is the licensee's full responsibility to pay for any supervision or monitoring services. All potential supervisors or monitors must

be approved by the Board before providing services. The Board Chair is delegated the authority to review all potential supervisors or monitors for adequacy.

NEW BUSINESS

TAB 16 Long Range Planning Survey Results

The Director of the Division of Medical Quality Assurance(MQA) within the Department of Health requested the development of a survey to elicit responses from board/council members in preparation of the 2011 Board/Council long-Range Planning meeting on September 27, 2011.

Ms. Garcia indicated she plans to attend the upcoming annual MQA Board Chairs/Vice-Chairs meeting in September. Ms. Garcia stated any additional comments from the Board members

may be sent to the Board office, prior to that meeting, and she will be sure to present those as well.

TAB 17 SB 146 Jim King Keep Florida Working Act

The Legislature passed and the Governor signed SB 146 the “Jim King Keep Florida Working Act” amending s. 112.011, F.S. Among other provisions, the law requires the Department to submit a report by December 31, 2011 and every four years thereafter listing all laws or rules “that disqualify from employment or licensure persons who have been convicted of a crime and have completed any incarceration and restitution to which they have been sentenced for such crime”.

The Department requests each Board to conduct a review of their laws and rules to determine if any provisions exist that would automatically disqualify an applicant.

MOTION: Ms. Banta made a motion that the Board of Occupational Therapy Practice does not have any specific OT laws or rules that would disqualify persons with prior convictions from employment or licensure. Mr. Mullings seconded the motion, which carried 6/0.

TAB 18 HB 155 Privacy of Firearm Owners

This Legislation prohibits a licensed health care practitioner or licensed health care facility from intentionally entering any disclosed information concerning firearm ownership into a patient’s health record, if the information is not relevant to the patient’s medical care or safety, or the safety of others. Additionally, licensed health care providers and health care facilities are:

- prohibited from inquiring whether oral or written, about the ownership of firearms or ammunition unless the information is relevant to the patient’s medical care or safety, or the safety of others;
- prohibited from discriminating against a patient based upon whether a patient exercises his or her constitutional right to own and possess firearms or ammunition; and
- mandated to respect a patient’s right to own or possess a firearm and refrain from harassing a patient about firearm ownership during an examination.

MOTION: After Discussion, Ms. Dunbar made a motion that the Board of Occupational Therapy’s current disciplinary guidelines are sufficient, and rule development is not required, should an OT/OTA licensee violate this new law. Mr. Mullings seconded the motion, which carried 6/0.
