**RULE STATUS REPORT**

**Tab 1 Dror Lewy, Assistant Attorney General**

- Executive Order Number 11-01

Mr. Lewy briefed the Board on the Executive Order issued by Governor Scott which suspends all rulemaking.

- HB1565-Legislative Rules Reform

Mr. Lewy briefed the Board on HB 1565 which amends the rulemaking procedures with respect to agencies' preparation of a statement of estimated regulatory cost (SERC) for proposed rules and requires legislative ratification of certain rules.

- Rules Report

Rule 64B17-3.001, Licensure as a Physical Therapist by Examination  
Rule 64B17-3.003, Licensure by Endorsement  
Rule 64B17-4.001, Licensure as a Physical Therapist Assistant by Examination  
Rule 64B17-4.003, Licensure by Endorsement

The above rules have been noticed for development and language has been approved. The rulemaking process will continue once the Executive Order to suspend rulemaking has been lifted.

Mr. Lewy explained to the Board the Joint Administrative Procedures Committee's (JAPC) requirements needed on future petition publishings.

- Proposed Language

During the November meeting, the Board requested Counsel to prepare draft language to clarify the language to define that one (1) credit hour is the equivalent to one (1) continuing education hour.

Counsel presented the following draft:

64B17-9.001 Continuing Education

(2) A contact hour shall consist of fifty clock minutes. One half contact hour shall consist of twenty-five clock minutes. One continuing educational unit (CEU) shall be considered equivalent to ten (10) contact hours. One credit hour is equivalent to one continuing education hour.

The Board verbally amended the below language to be removed from (6)(a) of the rule and added to (2).

(6) The Board approves for continuing education credit:

(a) Courses sponsored by a program in physical therapy at a college or university which provides a curriculum for training physical therapists or physical therapist assistants, when approved by the physical therapy or physical therapy assistants program, which is accredited by, or has status with an accrediting agency approved by the United States Department of Education. ~~One credit hour is the equivalent of one contact education hour.~~

Mr. Lewy informed the Board that he would prepare a clean draft of the proposed language to be presented at the May 2011 Board meeting.

Ms. Acuna-Parker joined the meeting at approximately 7:04pm.

- Clinical Instructors and Continuing Education

The Board discussed the current rules and the allowance of continuing education for clinical instructors. The Florida physical therapy rule does not define "clinical instructor" as being allowed to receive continuing education credit.

The Board expressed an interest in awarding continuing education for clinical instructors conducting clinical internships. The certification course for clinical instructors is given by

the American Physical Therapy Association (APTA) and licensees receive credit for completing the course..

Gwen Creel approached the Board and asked the Board to continue this discussion to the May meeting so that the Florida Physical Therapy Association (FPTA) and others can address the Board.

- Proposed Motion Language

Mr. Lewy prepared an outline of motions required for each type of case the prosecuting attorney will present.

Mr. Lewy and Ms. Shah agreed to work together to provide motion language to the Board.

The Board expressed confusion regarding disciplinary cases and requested a summary of the cases. Ms. Shah explained that a summary cannot be provided due to a biased opinion of the prosecutor but when the cases are presented to the Board a penalty recommendation will be made and the Board can discussed whether or not it will be accepted.

## **NEW BUSINESS**

### **Tab 7 Standardized Supervision Forms**

Board staff received a request from a current Board member to develop standardized supervision forms for disciplined licensees. These forms would be used for the licensee's monitor to communicate with the Department of Health's Compliance Management Unit. There is currently a generic set and a physical therapy set of forms, however these are only used as reference when the Final Order does not provide specific language for the monitor and the monitor reports.

Ms. Acuna-Parker requested that all monitor reports are reviewed by the Board prior to the reinstatement of a licensee's license to practice. The Board agreed that a standardized form should be provided to the monitors to be used when completing their reports. The Board requested that monitor reports be included in future agendas for licensees requesting termination of probation.

Mr. Lohr suggested more specific language in the licensee's Final Order regarding monitor requirements.

### **Tab 8 Continuing Competency**

Dr. Hellman tabled this discussion to be included in Tab 15.

### **Tab 9 Student Presentation**

Past Board member, Sandy Davis, developed a presentation for physical therapy students with information pertaining to the licensure process and the laws and rules. She requested the Board review and consider sending to PT/PTA programs or use in any way the Board may see fit.

### **Tab 10 Foreign Education Review Process**

Dr. Hellman, Education Liaison, requested this be discussed so that it is clear how much discretion the liaison may have when reviewing evaluations.

Staff is also requesting the Board considering revising the review process by only submitting applications whose education is not equivalent and allow staff to review the applications and evaluations that are deemed equivalent.

Mr. Hall provided the Board with an overview of the current education review process and staff suggestions for improvement. Board staff is suggesting eliminating the monthly education review as a way to improve the approval processing for foreign applicants. The proposed process would consist of a weekly approval which would expedite the testing procedures for foreign trained candidates. The approved applications would be placed on a ratification list for the Board to approve as the U.S. trained candidates are. Applications which are found not to be equivalent in terms of education would be placed on the next agenda for the full Board to review.

**MOTION:** Ms. Baker made a motion to accept the proposed request. Foreign trained applications are to be reviewed by board staff and approved for testing if their education is deemed equivalent. The motion was seconded by Ms. Middleton and carried 7/0.

## **Tab 11 Foreign Credentialing Agencies**

Currently the Board accepts two credentialing agencies to perform education evaluations for foreign trained applicants. The two agencies are the International Consultants of Delaware (ICD) and the Foreign Credentialing Commission on Physical Therapy (FCCPT). Staff has encountered some issues with these credentialing agencies.

Florida utilizes the retrospective coursework tools and has further broke down CWT 4 so that applicants are evaluated based on the requirements in place when they graduated, per Rule 64B17-3.001(3)(b)1c. This information has been relayed to FCCPT on more than one occasion; however, staff continuously receives evaluations that are not broken down to Florida's requirements. Board staff attempts to alleviate confusion for board members by writing notes on the evaluations.

The Board has said on many occasions that they heavily rely on the credentialing agencies to determine an applicants eligibility therefore staff is requesting the Board to prepare a memo to FCCPT asking for consistency and to apply Florida's rule when preparing evaluations.

Board staff continuously receives complaints from applicants using the International Consultants of Delaware (ICD) in regards to the inability of applicants being able to contact ICD by telephone or e-mails, inconsistencies in their reports, and the length of time to complete an evaluation. These complaints are strictly from applicants and staff is making no assumption to the validity of these complaints. The intent is to inform the Board of the possible issues.

**MOTION:** Ms. Acuna-Parker made a motion to address the credentialing agencies using the FSBPT's coursework tools and seek a description of their credentialing to be compared to the requirements in rule. The motion was seconded by Ms. Middleton and carried 7/0.

Board staff is delegated to prepare a notice and contact the credentialing agencies using the FSBPT course work tools then to prepare a report for an upcoming Board meeting.

Mr. Lohr volunteered to prepare a memo to FCCPT asking for consistency in preparing reports.

**DISCIPLINARY PROCEEDINGS**

**MOTION FOR SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT**

**Tab 1     Jerry Aguiar, PTA39, Case No. 2010-15469  
(PCP – Acuna-Parker, Watson, Stoff)**

Ms. Acuna-Parker was recused due to participation in the Probable Cause Panel.

Respondent was not present nor represented by legal counsel.

Ms. Shah summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was charged with violating Section 486.125(1)(k), Florida Statutes (2007-2009) by violating any provision of Chapter 486, Florida Statutes, or any rules adopted pursuant thereto by failing to meet the continuing education requirements as set forth in Rule 64B17-9.001, Florida Administrative Code.

The case was presented as a Settlement Agreement that would impose the following:

- Appearance
- Letter of Concern
- Costs in the amount of \$562.26 to be paid within 365 days of the filing of the Final Order.
- Registration of the Florida laws and rules exam within sixty (60) days of the filing of the Final Order. Successful completion of the Florida laws and rules exam to be completed within 12 months of the filing of the Final Order.

**MOTION:** After discussion, Ms. Baker made a motion to reject the Settlement Agreement. The motion was seconded by Dr. Petraglia and carried 6/0.

**MOTION:** After discussion, Dr. Hellman made a motion to offer the Respondent the following Counter Agreement:

- Letter of Concern
- Costs in the amount of \$562.26 to be paid within 365 days of the filing of the Final Order.
- Completion of the pending twenty (20) continuing education hours to be completed within six (6) months from the filing of the Final Order.
- Response to the counter offer within fifteen (15) days.

The motion was seconded by Dr. Petraglia and carried 6/0.

**Tab 2 Michael Horan, PTA16180, Case No. 2010-09240  
(PCP – Acuna-Parker, Watson, Stoff)**

Ms. Acuna-Parker was recused due to participation in the Probable Cause Panel.

Respondent was present and sworn in by the court reporter. Respondent was represented by Darby Hurtz, Esq.

Ms. Shah summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was charged with the following violations: **Count I:** Section 455.624(1)(w), Florida Statutes (1999) by failing to report to the Board prior to October 1, 1999 that he had entered a plea of nolo contendere to a crime that occurred before July 1, 1999. **Count II:** Section 456.072(1)(x) Florida Statutes (2006) or Section 486.125(1)(k), Florida Statutes (2006) or both by failing to report to the Board within 30 days after March 8, 2007 that he was found guilty of a crime. **Count III:** Section 456.072(1)(x), Florida Statutes (2007) or Section

486.125(1)(k), Florida Statutes (2007) or both by failing to report to the Board within 30 days after July 31, 2007 that he was found guilty of a crime.

The case was presented as a Settlement Agreement that would impose the following:

- Appearance
- Letter of Concern
- Fine in the amount of \$1,000 to be paid within 365 days from the filing of the Final Order.
- Costs in the amount of \$1,441.56 to be paid within 365 days from the filing of the Final Order.
- Registration of the Florida laws and rules exam within sixty (60) days of the filing of the Final Order. Successful completion of the Florida laws and rules exam to be completed within twelve (12) months of the filing of the Final Order.

**MOTION:** After discussion, Dr. Petraglia made a motion to accept the Settlement Agreement. The motion was seconded by Mr. Rust and carried 6/0.

**Tab 3 William Justin Tait, PT24174, Case No. 2009-03975  
(PCP – Babb, Watson, Bumgarner)**

Respondent was present and sworn in by the court reporter. Respondent was represented by Mr. William Furlow, Esq. Dr. Brown, PRN, was sworn in by the court reporter.

Ms. Shah summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was charged with the following violations: **Count I:** Section 486.125(1)(k), Florida Statutes (2008) by violating Section 456.072(1)(z), Florida Statutes (2008). **Count II:** Section 486.125(1)(a)(1), Florida Statutes (2008) by being unable to practice physical therapy with reasonable skill and safety to patients by reason of illness or use of alcohol, drugs, narcotics, chemicals or any other type of material or as a result of any mental or physical condition.

The case was presented as a Settlement Agreement that would impose the following:

- Appearance
- Costs in the amount of \$6,549.79 to be paid within 3 years from the filing of the Final Order.
- Fine in the amount of \$1,500 to be paid within 3 years of the filing of the Final Order.
- Indefinite suspension from practice until such time as the following conditions are met:
  - Respondent successfully completes 6 months of PRN treatment
  - PRN advocates during a Board meeting that Respondent is safe to practice
  - The Board determines Respondent is safe to practice.
- Lifetime PRN contract

Dr. Brown, PRN, addressed the Board to advocate for Mr. Tait. Concerns with the weekly workload will be reviewed with workplace monitors by PRN.

Mr. Furlow addressed the Board to advocate for Mr. Tait. He discussed work and personal goals that Mr. Tait has established to assist him in his recovery.

**MOTION:** After discussion, Ms. Baker made a motion to accept the Settlement Agreement. The motion was seconded by Dr. Petraglia and carried 7/0.

Ms. Shah clarified the terms in the Settlement Agreement and recommended the Board lift the suspension on his license.

**MOTION:** Ms. Baker made a motion to lift the Respondent's suspension as he has complied with the applicable conditions in the Settlement Agreement. The motion was seconded by Ms. Acuna-Parker and carried 7/0.

#### **INFORMAL HEARING NOT INVOLVING DISPUTED ISSUES OF MATERIAL FACT**

##### **Tab 4      Kesnel Delva, PTA2085, Case No. 2007-18472 (PCP – Hellman, Candela, Hughes)**

Dr. Hellman was recused due to participation in the Probable Cause Panel. Ms. Acuna-Parker, Vice Chair, was directed to Chair this tab.

Respondent was present and sworn in by the court reporter. The Respondent was represented by Joseph Rosenbaum, Esq. Joanne Sealy was present and sworn in the by the court reporter to speak on behalf of Mr. Delva.

Ms. Shah summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was charged with the following violations: **Count I:** Section 456.072(1)(c), Florida Statutes (2000) by entering a plea of nolo contendere to False Imprisonment, a crime related to the practice of physical therapy; **Count II:** Section 486.125(1)(c), Florida Statutes (2000) by entering a plea of nolo contendere to False Imprisonment, a crime related to the practice of physical therapy; **Count III:** Section 456.072(1)(w), Florida Statutes (2000) by failing to report to the Board that he had entered a plea of nolo contendere or guilty to a crime within 30 days after July 14, 2000; **Count IV:** Section 456.072(1)(c), Florida Statutes (2009) by entering a plea of nolo contendere to one or more counts of Insurance Fraud, a crime related to the practice of physical therapy; **Count V:** Section 486.125(1)(c) Florida Statutes (2009) by entering a plea of nolo contendere to one or more counts of Insurance Fraud, a crime related to the practice of physical therapy; **Count VI:** Section 456.072(1)(x) Florida Statutes (2009) by failing to report to the Board that he had entered a plea of nolo contendere or guilty to a crime within 30 days after July 17, 2009.

**MOTION:** Ms. Baker made a motion that the Respondent was properly served and requested an informal hearing. The motion was seconded by Dr. Petraglia and carried 6/0.

**MOTION:** Ms. Baker made a motion that the material facts, as alleged in the Administrative Complaint, are not in dispute, and adopt the allegations of fact in the Administrative Complaint, as the conclusions of fact in this proceeding. The motion was seconded by Dr. Petraglia and carried 6/0.

An associate of the Respondent, Ms. Sealy, addressed the Board to advocate for Mr. Delva's character.

**MOTION:** Ms. Baker made a motion to adopt the allegations of law in the Administrative Complaint, as the conclusions of law in this proceeding. The motion was seconded by Dr. Petraglia and carried 6/0.

**MOTION:** Ms. Baker made a motion to adopt the materials under Tab 4 and any addendum materials under Tab 4 into evidence in this proceeding. The motion was seconded by Dr. Petraglia and carried 6/0.

Mr. Hall informed the Board that the Respondent will not be allowed to renew his license with the Department of Health due to the statutory requirements of Section 456.0635(2), Florida Statutes.

Mr. Rosenbaum stated that he felt that statutory requirements do not apply to his client.

**MOTION:** After discussion, Dr. Petraglia made a motion to impose the following penalties:

- Reprimand
- Revocation
- Fine of \$11,000 to be paid within thirty (30) days from the filing of the Final Order.
- Costs of \$3,322.14 to be paid within thirty (30) days from the filing of the Final Order.

The motion was seconded by Ms. Ms. Baker and passed with a 5/1 vote. Mr. Rust opposed.

### **MOTION FOR DETERMINATION OF WAIVER AND ENTRY OF FINAL ORDER FOLLOWING HEARING**

#### **Tab 5      John Mulfinger, PT18909, Case No. 2010-03587 (PCP – Acuna-Parker, Clendenin, Davis)**

Ms. Acuna-Parker was recused due to participation in Probable Cause Panel.

Respondent was not present nor represented by legal counsel.

Ms. Shah summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was charged with violating Section 486.125(1)(h), by violating a lawful order of the Department or the Board previously entered in a disciplinary hearing.

**MOTION:** Ms. Baker made a motion to find that the Respondent was properly served and has waived his right to a hearing, as to disputed issues of fact. The motion was seconded by Dr. Petraglia and carried 6/0.

**MOTION:** Dr. Petraglia made a motion that the material facts, as alleged in the Administrative Complaint, are not in dispute, and adopt the allegations of fact in the

Administrative Complaint, as the conclusions of fact in this proceeding. The motion was seconded by Ms. Baker and carried 6/0.

**MOTION:** Dr. Petraglia made a motion to adopt the allegations of law in the Administrative Complaint, as the conclusions of law in this proceeding. The motion was seconded by Ms. Baker and carried 6/0.

**MOTION:** Dr. Petraglia made a motion to adopt the materials under Tab 5 and any addendum materials under Tab 5 into evidence in this proceeding. The motion was seconded by Ms. Baker and carried 6/0.

**MOTION:** After discussion, Dr. Petraglia made a motion to impose the following penalties:

- Reprimand
- Suspension until Respondent successfully passes the Florida laws and rules exam.
- Fine in the amount of \$1,000 to be paid within 180 days of the filing of the Final Order.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Lohr and passed with a 6/0 vote.

**MOTION:** Ms. Baker made a motion to assess the costs of \$774.19 to be paid within 180 days of the filing of the Final Order. The motion was seconded by Dr. Petraglia and passed with a 6/0 vote.

#### **MOTION FOR BOARD'S FINAL ACTION BY VOLUNTARY RELINQUISHMENT**

##### **Tab 6 Raymundo Arellano, PT11585, Case No. 2010-15790 (PCP – Acuna-Parker, Watson, Stoff)**

Ms. Acuna-Parker was recused due to participation in Probable Cause Panel.

Respondent was not present nor represented by legal counsel.

Respondent was charged with the following violations: **Count I:** Section 455.624(1)(h), Florida Statutes (1997) by obtaining a license to practice a profession through an error of the Department or the Board; **Count II:** Section 456.072(1)(h), Florida Statutes (2009) by obtaining or renewing a license to practice a profession through an error of the Department or the Board.

The case was presented as a Voluntary Relinquishment of licensure, in lieu of further disciplinary proceedings.

**MOTION:** Dr. Hellman made a motion to accept the Voluntary Relinquishment. The motion was seconded by Dr. Petraglia and passed with a 6/0 vote.

#### **REPORT**

##### **Tab 7 Prosecuting Attorney Report**

Ms. Shah presented the Board with a status report (Exhibit H) of the current disciplinary cases in process.

**MOTION:** Dr. Hellman made a motion to allow Ms. Shah to continue prosecuting disciplinary cases older than 1 year. The motion was seconded by Mr. Lohr and carried 7/0.

Ms. Shah introduced herself to the Board as the new Prosecuting Attorney.

Ms. DiConcilio announced a new plan regarding the waiver of Probable Cause for lesser offenses to include, but not limited to:

- Violation of Final Order
- Violation of biennium renewal confirming completion of continuing education

She also discussed a language change in the Settlement Agreement regarding an inflation of costs to be allowed if necessary so the Board may recuperate all costs.

The Board provided their support on the discussed changes.

## **REQUEST FOR MONITOR APPROVAL**

### **Tab 8 Robert Gordon Robbins, PTA14237, Case No. 2009-08784 (PCP – Hellman, Watson, Bumgarner)**

Dr. Hellman recused herself from this request due to her participation in the Probable Cause Panel when this case was previously considered. Ms. Acuna-Parker was directed to Chair this tab.

Mr. Robbins was present and sworn in by the court reporter. Mr. DesJardine was present and sworn in by the court reporter.

Mr. Robbins appeared before the board on November 5, 2010 in consideration of a Settlement Agreement on Case No. 2009-08784. As outlined in his Settlement Agreement, Mr. Robbins is required to obtain a Board approved monitor in order to practice.

His Agreement allows for temporary approval of a monitor by the Board Chair until formal approval can be granted at the next available board meeting. As the Board Chair was recused from this case, the Vice Chair was delegated to approve the monitor request. Ms. Acuna-Parker granted temporary approval of the proposed monitor on November 19, 2010.

Mr. Robbins addressed the Board to discuss his relationship with his proposed monitor.

**MOTION:** After discussion, Ms. Baker made a motion to approve Mr. Robbins' proposed monitor. The motion was seconded by Dr. Petraglia and carried 6/0.

Dr. Hellman addressed Mr. Robbins written article and requested another be written explaining what he has learned from his experience.

Ms. Acuna-Parker requested that the Board consider proposed monitors to take and pass the Florida Laws and Rules exam.

Mr. Lewy informed the Board that they may set their own requirements for future monitors. Dr. Petraglia expressed concerns for requiring the monitor the expense of paying for an examination.

## **PETITION FOR VARIANCE OR WAIVER OF RULE**

### **Tab 9 Louis Greenwald, Physical Therapist by Endorsement**

Mr. Greenwald was present and sworn in by the court reporter.

#### a) Petition for Variance or Waiver of Rule 64B17-3.003

Mr. Greenwald informed the Board that he has been volunteering without a license in a physical therapy setting since June 2010. Mr. Lewy advised Mr. Greenwald to cease performing physical therapy duties until a valid Florida license is obtained.

**MOTION:** After discussion, Ms. Acuna-Parker made a motion to grant the Petition for Variance or Waiver of Rule 64B17-3.003 and to require a monitor to be approved by the Board within 3 months.

After further discussion, Ms. Acuna-Parker withdrew her motion.

Ms. Acuna-Parker advised Mr. Greenwald that as an unlicensed individual he cannot instruct a licensed healthcare professional on physical therapy. He was directed to cease any physical therapy practice at this time.

**MOTION:** After discussion, Ms. Acuna-Parker made a motion to grant the Petition for Variance or Waiver of Rule 64B17-3.003 and approve the application for the laws and rules exam and upon a passing score on the exam shall be licensed with the following conditions:

- Direct supervision for a period of 3 months. The Chair is delegated to approve the proposed monitor prior to licensure.

The motion was seconded by Ms. Middleton and carried 6/1. Mr. Lohr opposed.

### **Tab 10 Sandra Cuik, Physical Therapist by Endorsement**

Ms. Cuik was present and sworn by the court reporter. Ms. Cuik was represented by Monica Rodriguez, Esq.

Ms. Rodriguez addressed the Board to discuss a previous credential evaluation by the International Credentialing Associates (ICA) which found Ms. Cuik to have an education deemed equivalent. She clarified the concerns with Ms. Cuik's name history.

#### a) Petition for Variance or Waiver of Rule 64B17-3.003

**MOTION:** After discussion, Ms. Acuna-Parker made a motion to grant the Petition for Variance or Waiver of Rule 64B17-3.003 and approve the application for the laws and rules exam and upon a passing score on the exam shall be licensed. The motion was seconded by Ms. Baker and carried 7/0.

### **Tab 11 Christopher Stone, Physical Therapist Assistant by Examination**

Mr. Stone appeared at the November 5, 2010 Board meeting at which his application for licensure was approved. After this approval, Mr. Stone notified the board office of additional criminal charges which were not previously disclosed.

Mr. Stone was asked to appear for the Board to reconsider his application for licensure as his criminal history was not accurately disclosed on his application during his initial review.

Ms. Acuna-Parker inquired of Dr. Brown the probability of relapse of a particular drug or alcohol abuse over the span of 15-20 years. Dr. Brown stated that an accurate report could not be completed without a proper PRN evaluation.

Dr. Petraglia expressed concerns with further charges which are not known. She asked Mr. Stone regarding any other potential charges. Mr. Stone stated that he has no further criminal history which has not been disclosed to the Board.

Ms. Mavani's FCCPT credential evaluation was reviewed and not approved per the Education Liaison at the August 13, 2010 Education Review, due to pending credits in general education.

**MOTION:** After discussion, Dr. Petraglia made a motion to deny Ms. Mavani's application for licensure due to her second non-appearance. The motion was seconded by Ms. Middleton and carried 7/0.

**Tab 13 Dennis Bernardus Boom, Physical Therapist by Endorsement**

Mr. Boom was not present.

This tab was originally placed on the November 5, 2010 Board meeting agenda. The Board continued the tab due to the applicant's non-appearance.

Mr. Boom's FCCPT credential evaluation was reviewed and not approved per the Education Liaison at the August 13, 2010 Education Review, due to pending credits in general and professional education.

**MOTION:** After discussion, Dr. Petraglia made a motion to deny Mr. Boom's application for licensure due to his second non-appearance. The motion was seconded by Ms. Middleton and carried 7/0.

**Tab 14 Sandra Acosta, Physical Therapist by Examination**

Ms. Acosta was present and sworn in by the court reporter.

Ms. Acosta's application was reviewed and not approved by the Education Liaison at the November 12, 2010 Education Review, due to pending credits in general and professional education.

Ms. Acosta presented a previous evaluation from ICD which states Ms. Acosta had completed the previous pending courses.

**MOTION:** After discussion, Ms. Acuna-Parker made a motion to approve Ms. Acosta's application for licensure and to certify her to sit for the National Physical Therapy Exam and the Florida Laws and Rules Exam and upon a passing score on the exam shall be licensed. The Board requested that the new information regarding Ms. Van Niel's education history be evaluated by ICD.

Mr. Lewy explained the 90 day waiver process.

Ms. Van Niel waived her 90 day rights for the Board to act upon her application to allow ICD additional time to complete a re-evaluation for her courses.

**MOTION:** Ms. Baker made a motion to approve Ms. Firlej's application for licensure and to certify her to sit for the Florida Laws and Rules Exam and upon a passing score on the exam shall be licensed. The motion was seconded by Mr. Rust and carried 4/2. Mr. Lohr and Dr. Petraglia opposed.

#### **Tab 19 Tracy Guy, Physical Therapist by Examination**

Ms. Guy was present and sworn in by the court reporter.

Ms. Guy's application was reviewed and not approved per the Education Liaison at the January 5, 2011 Education Review, due to pending credits in general and professional education.

Ms. Osbourne was present and sworn in by the court reporter.

Ms. Osbourne's ICD credential evaluation was reviewed and not approved per the Education Liaison at the January 5, 2011 Education Review, due to pending credits in general and professional education.

**MOTION:** After discussion, Dr. Petraglia made a motion to approve Ms. Osbourne's application for licensure and to certify her to sit for the National Physical Therapy Exam and the Florida Laws and Rules Exam and upon a passing score on the exam shall be licensed. The motion was seconded by Ms. Acuna-Parker and carried 6/0.

#### **Tab 21 Liliana Soto, Physical Therapist by Endorsement**

Ms. Soto was not present.

Ms. Soto's NPTE score transfer indicates six (6) attempts on the National Physical Therapy Exam. Florida has a 5 time failure limit on the NPTE, as outlined in Section 486.051, Florida Statutes.

**486.051 Physical therapist; examination of applicant.**—The examinations of an applicant for licensing as a physical therapist shall be in accordance with rules adopted by the board, to test the applicant's qualifications and shall include the taking of a test by the applicant. If an applicant fails to pass the examination in three attempts, the applicant shall not be eligible for reexamination unless she or he completes additional educational or training requirements prescribed by the board. An applicant who has completed the additional educational or training requirements prescribed by the board may take the examination on two more occasions. If the applicant has failed to pass the examination after five attempts, she or he is no longer eligible to take the examination.

**MOTION:** After discussion, Dr. Petraglia made a motion to deny Ms. Soto's application for licensure as her examination history does not meet the requirements set forth in Section 486.05, Florida Statutes. The motion was seconded by Ms. Acuna-Parker and carried 6/0.

#### **Tab 22 Fazila Salim, Physical Therapist by Examination**

Ms. Salim was present and sworn in by the court reporter.

Ms. Salim submitted an application for Physical Therapist Licensure on October 6, 2010. She did not disclose her full exam history nor did she disclose the disciplinary history of her Florida PTA License. Board staff received confirmation from FSBPT that the candidate has failed the NPTE (PT) on six (6) occasions.

Florida has a 5 time failure limit on the NPTE, as outlined in Section 486.051, Florida Statutes.

**486.051 Physical therapist; examination of applicant.**—The examinations of an applicant for licensing as a physical therapist shall be in accordance with rules adopted by the board, to test the applicant's qualifications and shall include the taking of a test by the applicant. If an applicant fails to pass the examination in three attempts, the applicant shall not be eligible for reexamination unless she or he completes additional educational or training requirements prescribed by the board. An applicant who has

completed the additional educational or training requirements prescribed by the board may take the examination on two more occasions. If the applicant has failed to pass the examination after five attempts, she or he is no longer eligible to take the examination.

The Board allowed Ms. Salim to withdraw her application.
