Board staff requested the Board approve the proposed applications changes. These changes include updating the Departments' mission statement, using the same website address throughout and clarifying instructions.

Revisions need to be made to Rules 64B17-3.001, 3.003, 4.001, 4.003 to allow for application changes.

MOTION: After discussion, Dr. Hellman made a motion to approve the application changes incorporated in Rules 64B17-3.001; 3.003; 4.001 and 4.003 and directed counsel to move forward with rule promulgation. The motion was seconded by Ms. Acuna-Parker and carried 6/0.

- Rules Report

Mr. Levy discussed the status of the Board's rules which are currently undergoing revisions.

He also discussed the letter from the Joint Administrative Procedures Committee (JAPC) regarding the disciplinary guidelines being inconsistent with Chapter 456, Florida Statutes.

MOTION: Ms. Acuna-Parker made a motion to open Rule 64B17-7.001(1)(gg) for development to revise the rule to be consistent with the language of the statute. The motion was seconded by Dr. Hellman and carried 6/0.

Board directed Counsel to draft language and bring to the next meeting.

Mr. Lewy summarized Executive Order 11-211 for the Board which regarded a change in the current rule process.

MOTION: Mr. Lohr made a motion to keep the rule process as is. The motion was seconded by Ms. Middleton and carried 5/1. Dr. Petraglia opposed.

Also in attendance was Dr. Quillen, director of Physical Therapy at the University of South Florida, along with his class of DPT students; and Dr. Judy Rivenbark from Professionals Resource Network (PRN).

PERSONAL APPEARANCE

Tab 1 Chris Stone, Physical Therapist Assistant by Examination

Mr. Stone was present and sworn in by the court reporter. Dr. Judy Rivenbark was present from PRN to support his licensure.

History:

Mr. Stone appeared at the November 5, 2010 Board meeting at which his application for licensure was approved. After this approval, Mr. Stone notified the board office of additional charges which were not previously disclosed.

Mr. Stone appeared before the Board a second time on February 11, 2011. The Board reconsidered his application for licensure as his criminal history was not accurately disclosed on his application during his initial review. The Board approved Mr. Stone's application contingent upon completion and compliance with a PRN evaluation. His appearance is required prior to licensure and once he has complied with PRN's recommendation.

Mr. Stone appeared before the Board for a third time on May 13, 2011. He asked the Board to reduce PRN's recommendation. The Board voted to maintain PRN's recommendation for Mr. Stone's evaluation and contract.

Mr. Stone was asked to appear before the Board as board staff has received confirmation of his compliance with his PRN contract.

Dr. Rivenbark, PRN, addressed the Board to advocate on behalf of Mr. Stone's ability to practice.

After discussion, the Board acknowledged that Mr. Stone had complied with the recommendations of PRN and the Board's order.

MOTION: After discussion, Dr. Hellman made a motion to approve Mr. Stone's application for licensure. The motion was seconded by Ms. Acuna-Parker and carried 5/0.

DISCIPLINARY PROCEEDINGS

MOTION FOR FINAL ORDER BY RECOMMENDED ORDER

Tab 2 Marly Cueto, PT15759
DOH Case Nos. 2008-19847; 2009-23150
DOAH Case Nos. 11-1271PL; 11-1272PL
(PCP – Trittschuh, Hellman, Candela, Hughes)

Dr. Hellman was recused due to participation in the Probable Cause Panel.

Ms. Cueto was present but chose to not address the Board. She was represented by Mr. James Barclay, Esq.

Ms. Shah summarized the case for the Board.

In Case 2008-19847, a two count Administrative Complaint (AC) was filed.

Count I alleged a violation of Sections 486.125(1)(c) and 456.072(1)(c), Florida Statutes (2007), which provides being convicted or found guilty, regardless of adjudication, of a crime in any jurisdiction which directly relates to the practice of physical therapy or to the ability to practice physical therapy, constitutes grounds for disciplinary action and Section 486.125(1)(k), Florida Statutes (2007), for violating a provision of this chapter or chapter 456 or any rules adopted pursuant thereto, constitutes grounds for disciplinary action.

Count II alleged a violation of Section 456.072(1)(x), Florida Statutes (2007), for failing to report to the board, or the department of there is no board, in writing within 30 days after the licensee has been convicted or found guilty of, or entered a plea of nolo contendere to, regardless of adjudication, a crime in any jurisdiction, constitutes grounds for disciplinary action, and Section 486.125(1)(k), Florida Statutes (2007), for violating a provision of this chapter or chapter 456 or any rules adopted pursuant thereto, constitutes grounds for disciplinary action.

Mr. Barclay requested the Board recuse themselves from hearing this case due to prejudicial error.

Mr. Lewy proceeded with his opening statements.

Mr. Barclay introduced himself to the Board. He asked for the motion to be heard and considered. He stated for the record the exhibits that were withdrawn from evidence at the administrative hearing.

Mr. Lewy polled each board member asking if they could reach a fair conclusion on the Recommended Order with exceptions without considering the said exhibits.

The Board denied Mr. Barclay's motion as all members agreed to fairly consider the materials.

The following Exceptions, filed on behalf of Ms. Cueto, were considered by the Board:

MOTION: Ms. Acuna-Parker made a motion to reject the Exception to recuse the full board. The motion was seconded by Dr. Petraglia and carried 4/0.

Allegations in the AC: In September 2007 Medicaid Fraud Control Unit, hereinafter referred to as MFCU, began an investigation into the billing practices of the Respondent. On July 8, 2008, Medicaid Fraud Analyst Ms. Henry-Grant performed an analysis of the claims submitted by the Respondent to Medicaid between the dates of January 1, 2007 and April 22, 2008. The analysis was performed by examining only dates for which the Respondent billed Medicaid for services exceeding 36 units or 9 hours. The findings were as follows: the Respondent submitted a total of 5368 claims to Medicaid. MFCU Investigator Coleman interviewed recipients and guardians of the recipients for whom the Respondent billed services to Medicaid on the abovementioned dates. Following said interviews, it was determined that 611 of the 5,368 claims were fraudulent. The Respondent was paid three hundred sixty-one thousand six hundred eight-five dollars and fifteen cents (\$361,685.15) by Medicaid. Of that total, it was determined that the

Respondent was paid \$19,474.68 based on the 611 claims that she fraudulently submitted to Medicaid.

On or about August 25, 2008, the Special Designated Assistant Statewide Prosecutor filed an information against Respondent in Case Number 08-16209CF10A, OSP Number 2007-0418-FLL in the Circuit Court of the Seventeenth Judicial Circuit in and for Broward County, Florida.

The sole count of the information charged the Respondent as follows: [B]eginning on or about the 1st day January, 2007, and continuing through and including the 22nd day of April, in the Seventeenth and Second Judicial Circuits of Florida, to-wit: Broward and Leon Counties, Florida, [the Respondent], as part of a related transaction occurring in [two or more Florida judicial circuits] did knowingly obtain or use, or endeavor to obtain or use, the property of another, to-wit: U.S. currency, of the value of \$300.00 or more but less than \$20,000.00, said property being the property of another, to-wit: the State of Florida Agency for Health Care Administration and or it's [sic] fiscal agent and or South Florida Family Centers of a right to the property or benefit therefrom, or with the intent to appropriate the property to her own use or to the use of any person non entitled thereto; contrary to Florida Statutes sections 812.014(1) and (2)(c) and against the peace and dignity of the State of Florida.

The crime charged in the information is grand theft of the third degree and a felony of the third degree, according to Section 812.014(2)(c), Florida Statutes (2007). On or before November 5, 2008, the Respondent appeared in open court and entered a plea of nolo contendere to the sole count of the information. The Respondent's plea was accepted by the Court and judgment was entered on November 5, 2008. As of Friday, August 28, 2009, the Board of Physical Therapy Practice had no record of receiving written notice from the Respondent of her November 5, 2008 plea of nolo contendere.

The Respondent was properly served with the AC, she disputed the allegations, and subsequently requested a formal hearing at the Division of Administrative Hearings.

In Case 2009-23150, the administrative complaint charged a violation of Section 486.125(1)(k), Florida Statutes (2009), for violating a provision of this chapter or chapter 456 or any rules adopted pursuant thereto, constitutes grounds for disciplinary action, and Section 456.072(1)(kk), Florida Statutes (2009), which provides being terminated from the state Medicaid program pursuant to Section 409.913, any other state Medicaid program, or the federal Medicare program, unless eligibility to participate in the program from which the practitioner was terminated has been restored constitutes grounds for disciplinary action.

Allegations in the AC: The Agency for Health Care Administration (AHCA) is the State of Florida agency that oversees the Medicaid Program to provide medical services for indigent recipients. On October 6, 2009, AHCA entered a Final Order against the Respondent terminating her for cause from the Florida Medicaid program pursuant to Section 409.913, Florida Statutes.

The Respondent was properly served with the AC, she disputed the allegations, and subsequently requested a formal hearing at the Division of Administrative Hearings.

Upon motion by the Department, both cases were consolidated at the Division of Administrative Hearings.

MOTION: Dr. Petraglia made a motion to find that the Administrative Law Judge's finding of fact are accepted by the Board. The motion was seconded by Mr. Rust and carried 4/0.

Mr. Barclay continued with his statements.

Ruling on exceptions:

MOTION: Dr. Petraglia mad a motion to reject the Exception of finding of paragraph 12 and 16 stating she pled guilty to a crime relating to physical therapy. The motion was seconded by Mr. Lohr and carried 4/0.

MOTION: Dr. Petraglia made a motion to reject the Exception of paragraph 19 and find that Ms. Cueto was terminated for cause. The motion was seconded by Mr Lohr and carried 4/0.

MOTION: Dr. Petraglia made a motion to reject the Exception of paragraph 25 and conclude the mitigating circumstances are "a wash." The motion was seconded by Mr. Lohr and carried 4/0.

MOTION: Dr. Petraglia made a motion adopting the Administrative Law Judge's conclusions of law as the Board's conclusions of law in this proceeding. The motion was seconded by Mr. Lohr and carried 4/0.

Penalty:

As to penalty, the Administrative Law Judge recommended an administrative fine of \$14,000, suspension of Respondent's physical therapy license for two years, to be followed by two years probation on reasonable terms and conditions as the Board establishes, which may include that Respondent pay in full the \$28,000 she has been ordered to remit to AHCA as restitution of the stolen funds.

The Department filed an Exception to this recommendation and stands on that pleading as persuasive that the penalty should include the revocation of Respondent's license because of the magnitude of the theft, because she stole from a public welfare program, because she was caught in the act and had not stopped stealing on her own volition, and because the epidemic of Medicaid fraud needs to be dealt with forcefully by regulatory authorities.

Respondent filed an exception to the penalty as well and requested the Administrative Law Judge's recommendation be replaced by a fine of \$1000.

MOTION: Mr. Lohr made a motion to adopt the Administrative Law Judge's penalty recommendation. The motion was seconded by Dr. Petraglia and carried 3/1. Ms. Acuna-Parker opposed.

MOTION: Ms. Acuna-Parker made a motion to set the terms of probation:

- Probation for 2 years.
- 3 CVs be sent to Board Chair then supervisor be formally approved by Board.
- PRN evaluation.

Dr. Rivenbark informed the Board of what PRN can evaluate.

Ms. Acuna-Parker withdrew her motion.

MOTION: Mr. Lohr made a motion to set the terms of probation as follows:

- Direct supervision by a Physical Therapist, approved by the Board.
- Monthly reporting in regards to proper utilization and documentation to Medicaid program to the Department compliance officer.
- Passing score on the laws and rules exam prior to conclusion of probation.

The motion was seconded by Dr. Petraglia and carried 4/0.

Monthly reports must include the following:

- Reports must be submitted in affidavit form.
- Include why Respondent is on probation, where she is practicing, type of patients, compliance with any restrictions, relationship with supervisor, problems, if any; review of billing practices

Respondent shall submit 3 CVs to the Board Chair for temporary approval of the proposed monitor. Respondent and her monitor are required to appear before the next available Board meeting for formal approval.

MOTION: Mr. Lohr made a motion to specify the terms and how the monitor is to be chosen. The motion was seconded by Ms. Acuna-Parker and carried 4/0.

The costs for this case will be assessed at a later meeting.

MOTION FOR SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

Tab 3 Fe Vasquez Tan, PT7473, Case No. 2011-00989 (PCP – Lohr, Watson)

Mr. Lohr was recused due to participation in the Probable Cause Panel.

Respondent was present and sworn in by the court reporter.

Ms. Shah summarized the case for the Board. **Count I:** Respondent violated Section 486.125(1)(c), Florida Statutes by entering a plea of guilty to a crime which directly relates to the practice of physical therapy. **Count II:** Respondent violated Section 486.125(1)(k) Florida Statutes and Section 456.125(1)(c) (2010) entering a plea of guilty to a crime which directly relates to the practice of physical therapy.

The case was presented as a Settlement Agreement that would impose the following:

- Reprimand

- Appearance
- Fine of \$5,000 to be paid within 365 days of the date of the Final Order
- Costs in the amount of \$920.00 to be paid within 365 days of the date of the Final Order
- Registration for the Florida laws and rules exam within 60 days and successful passage within 1 year of the date of the Final Order
- Probation for 2 years from of the date of the Final Order
- Indirect supervision by a Board approved monitor for the length of probation

MOTION: After discussion, Dr. Hellman made a motion to accept the Settlement Agreement. The motion was seconded by Dr. Petraglia and carried 4/0.

**Tab 4 Michelle Moran, PT10827, Case No. 2010-22332
(PCP – Petraglia, Belser, Candela)**

Dr. Petraglia was recused due to participation in the Probable Cause Panel.

Respondent was not present nor represented by legal counsel.

Ms. Shah summarized the case for the Board. Respondent has violated Sections 486.125(1)(k) and 456.072(1)(x), Florida Statutes, by failing to report to the Board within 30 days of the following pleas on: March 31, 1998; March 11, 1999; April 13, 2000 and June 5, 2001.

The case was presented as a Settlement Agreement that would impose the following:

- Letter of concern
- Costs in the amount of \$456.79 to be paid within 365 days of the date of the Final Order.
- \$1000.00 fine to be paid within 365 days of the date of the Final Order
- Registration for the Florida laws and rules exam within 60 days and successful passage within 1 year of the date of the Final Order

MOTION: After discussion, Ms. Acuna-Parker made a motion to accept the Settlement Agreement. The motion was seconded by Mr. Rust and carried 4/0.

MOTION FOR BOARD’S FINAL ACTION BY VOLUNTARY RELINQUISHMENT

Respondent was not present.

Ms. Shah summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was charged with the following violation: Section 486.125(1)(h) Florida Statutes by violating a lawful order of the Board (Case No. 2009-02739).

The case was presented as a Voluntary Relinquishment of licensure, in lieu of further disciplinary proceedings.

MOTION: Dr. Petraglia made a motion to accept the Voluntary Relinquishment. The motion was seconded by Dr. Hellman and passed with a 5/0 vote.

Ms. McIntosh was present and sworn in by the court reporter. Her monitor, Timothy Crannell, was also present and sworn in by the court reporter.

History:

Ms. McIntosh appeared before the Board on November 5, 2010 in consideration of a Settlement Agreement on Case No. 2010-07208. As outlined in her Settlement Agreement, Ms. McIntosh is required to obtain a Board approved monitor in order to practice.

Her Agreement allows for temporary approval of a monitor by the Board Chair until formal approval can be granted at the next available board meeting. Dr. Hellman granted temporary approval of the proposed monitor on October 11, 2011.

The terms of Ms. McIntosh's probation are as follows:

- Respondent shall be restricted from practicing as a physical therapist in any home healthcare setting.
- Required indirect supervision under a physical therapist or other monitor approved by the Board.
- Respondent shall immediately advise the Board if the approved monitor is unable or unwilling to fulfill the responsibilities of a supervising physical therapist.
- Respondent has the opportunity to petition the Board for early termination or modification of his probation after serving twelve (12) months.

- Respondent's supervisor must appear before the Board at the meeting at which the Settlement Agreement is heard or the first meeting following commencement of the probation.

The supervisor's responsibilities, as outlined in the Settlement Agreement, are as follows:

- On a quarterly basis, review at least ten (10) of Respondent's active patient/treatment records and billing records.
- Quarterly reports submitted by the supervisor which shall include explanation of probation, description of practice, compliance with terms, relationship with Respondent, statement advising the Board of any problems which have arisen, summary of the number of records reviewed and the quality of the records.
- Report any violations by Respondent to the Board immediately.
- Appearance before the Board at the first meeting following commencement of the probation.

Dr. Rivenbark informed the Board that she is in full compliance with her PRN contract.

MOTION: Ms. Acuna-Parker made a motion to approve Mr. Crannell as the supervising monitor for Ms. McIntosh. The motion was seconded by Dr. Petraglia and carried 5/0.

REQUEST FOR TERMINATION OF PROBATION

Tab 9 Hubert Marquez, PTA19409, Case No. 2006-25733

Mr. Marquez was present and sworn in by the court reporter.

History:

Mr. Marquez first appeared before the Board September 14, 2007. Ms. Quimby-Penncock, Prosecuting Attorney, presented the case as a Settlement Agreement. Respondent was charged with failing to maintain acceptable standards of physical therapy practice and for having committed fraud in the practice of physical therapy. The Board rejected the terms of the Settlement Agreement and provided a counter-offer. Mr. Marquez did not accept the counter agreement. The case was presented at the March 7, 2008 meeting as an Informal Hearing with the following terms:

- Suspension for 1 year
- Probation for 2 years following suspension
- Fine of \$10,000.00 (\$1,127.34 remaining)
- Costs of \$3,828.61 to be paid at the time of probation termination (Completed 10/11/11)
- Registration for the Florida laws and rules exam by 6/27/2008 (completed 2/8/2010) and successful passage by 4/28/2009 (completed 4/20/2010).

On May 15, 2009 Mr. Marquez petitioned the Board for reinstatement of his license. The Board lifted the suspension and defined the following terms for probation:

- Two years probation to include direct supervision by a Board approved monitor

- Quarterly reports from the monitor
- Appearance before the Board prior to termination of probation

Mr. Nasim Hashmi (PT2278) was approved as Mr. Marquez's monitor on December 13, 2009. Though Mr. Marquez's terms required a monitor for the length of his probation period, he requested a modification of his Final Order on November 5, 2010. The Board granted the request by lifting the monitor requirement for the remainder of his probation.

MOTION: After discussion, Dr. Petraglia made a motion to terminate Mr. Marquez's probation once the final balance of his fine has been paid. The motion was seconded by Mr. Lohr and carried 5/0.
