**Tab 1      Hubert Marquez, PTA19409, Case No. 2006-25733**

Mr. Marquez was present and sworn in by Board Counsel. His attorney, Mr. David Anderson, Esq., was also present.

Mr. Marquez submitted a request to modify his Final Order of Case Number 2009-25733. He requested that the Board reduce his probationary period.

**MOTION:** After discussion, Mr. Lohr made a motion to grant the modification of Mr. Marquez's Final Order by lifting the required monitor. The motion was seconded by Mr. Rust and carried

## **NEW BUSINESS**

### **Tab 10 Request to Propose Legislative Change Section 486.161(3)**

The board office received a request regarding Section 486.161(3), Florida Statutes, and the use of present language. This has been asked to be brought to the Board's attention for consideration of legislative change.

As FPTA is organizing a task force to discuss this issue, Dr. Hellman tabled this tab until the FPTA task force is developed and provides a report to the Board.

### **Tab 11 Standardized Supervision Forms**

The board office received a request from a current Board member to develop standardized supervision forms for disciplined licensees. These forms would be used for the licensee's monitor to communicate with the Department of Health's Compliance Management Unit. There is currently a generic set and a physical therapy set of forms, however these are only used as reference when the Final Order does not provide specific language for the monitor and the monitor reports.

This discussion was tabled to the February 2011 Board meeting.

## **Tab 12 Continuing Competency**

The Board discussed the issue of continuing competency in regards to licensure renewal. The physical therapy practice act currently requires 24 hours of continuing education, with a maximum of 12 hours from homestudy courses, to be completed each licensure biennium. Within these 24 hours, a 2 hour course on the Prevention of Medical Errors is required of all active licensees.

This discussion was tabled to the February 2011 Board meeting.

## **OLD BUSINESS**

### **Tab 13 English Proficiency Requirement**

At the August 6, 2010 Board meeting, Board Counsel discussed a rule challenge to the Board's English proficiency requirement and the lack of specific statutory authority. The Board requested board staff to conduct research with other jurisdictions in regards to their English requirement for licensure. Board staff received several replies from other state boards via the Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy (FSBPT) message boards and a detailed report outlining jurisdiction requirements. Based on this report, 41 states require English proficiency for purposes of licensure. This report is current as of July 2010.

Mr. Lewy discussed the proposed language and the processed involved with proposing a legislative change. Also discussed were the English proficiency requirements for other states. The Board expressed confidence in an applicant's English abilities as both required examinations, the National Physical Therapy Exam and the Florida laws and rules exam are only available in the English language.

**MOTION:** After discussion, Mr. Rust moved to not pursue any proposed legislative changes regarding English proficiency. The motion was seconded by Mr. Lohr and carried 5/1. Dr. Petraglia opposed.

### **Tab 14 Request to Propose Legislative Change Section 456.074**

At the August 2010 Board meeting, the Board discussed Emergency Suspension Orders and giving specific statutory authority to the Physical Therapy Board for this authority. Several members expressed concerns with the proposal of adding the Physical Therapy statute, Chapter 486, to the pre-existing guidelines for Emergency Suspension Orders in Chapter 456. The Board requested an opinion from Board Counsel to determine the pros and cons of adding Physical Therapy to the listed professions in Chapter 456 or adding new legislative language to our own practice act.

Ms. Daniels discussed the difference in definition of the terms "may" and "shall" to clarify the legislative authority in statute.

**MOTION:** Dr. Hellman made a motion to not pursue any proposed legislative changes regarding Section 456.074, Florida Statutes. The motion was seconded by Mr. Rust and carried 6/0.

### **Tab 15 FSBPT Exam Suspension**

Effective July 12, 2010, the Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy (FSBPT) has

suspended testing of the National Physical Therapy Exam (NPTE) for all graduates of India, Pakistan, Egypt and the Philippines due to a security breach. Since the discussion of this issue at the August 2010 Board meeting, there have been several developments with the exam release for those candidates affected by this action.

Mr. Hall informed the Board of the Request for Information that the Florida Department of Health has distributed to other states regarding the development of a secondary licensure examination. The FSBPT has released testing dates for candidates of those countries affected by the exam suspension. At this time, the testing dates for the new NPTE-i are scheduled for May 25, 2011 and December 5, 2011.

Shari Sandifer, a representative from Avant Healthcare Professionals, addressed the Board to discuss her concerns with the FSBPT exam suspension and legal action taken against the state of Georgia.

**DISCIPLINARY PROCEEDINGS**

**MOTION FOR SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT**

**Tab 1      Robert Gordon Robbins, PTA14237, Case No. 2009-08784  
(PCP – Hellman, Watson, Bumgarner)**

Dr. Hellman was recused due to participation in the Probable Cause Panel. Ms. Acuna-Parker

was directed to Chair this tab.

Respondent was present and sworn in by the court reporter. George Billiris was also present and sworn in by the court reported. Mr. Billiris was present as Mr. Robbins' proposed monitor.

Ms. Daniels summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was charged with the following violations: **Count I:** Respondent violates Section 486.125(1)(k), F.S. (2008), and Section 456.072(1)(m), F.S. (2008), by making deceptive, untrue, or fraudulent representations in or related to the practice of a profession of employing a trick or scheme in or related to the practice of a profession. **Count II:** Respondent violated Section 486.125(1)(k), F.S. (2008) and Section 486.125(1)(e), F.S. (2008), by violating Florida Administrative Code Rule 64B17-6.001(2)(e). **Count III:** Respondent violates Section 456.072(1)(l), F.S. (2008), by making or filing a report or record which the licensee knows to be false.

The case was presented as a Settlement Agreement that would impose the following:

- Appearance
- Letter of Concern
- Fine of \$1,000.00 to be paid within two (2) years of the filing of the Final Order.
- Costs in the amount of \$4,014.22 to be paid within two (2) years of the filing of the Final Order.
- Within thirty (30) days of the issuance of the Final Order, Respondent shall submit a publishable-quality article explaining what he has learned from this experience.
- Six (6) month probation from the date of the filing of the Final Order accepting and incorporating the Settlement Agreement or the date of the Board's reinstatement of Respondent's license from suspension, whichever is later. Respondent must follow the terms of probation outlined in the Settlement Agreement to include:
  - Required supervision
  - Respondent may petition the Board for early termination of probation after a period of twelve (12) months.
- Respondent's supervisor must appear before the Board at the meeting at which the Settlement Agreement is heard or the first meeting following commencement of the probation.
- Registration of the Florida laws and rules exam within sixty (60) days of the filing of the Final Order. Successful completion of the Florida laws and rules exam to be completed within twelve (12) months of the filing of the Final Order.

The Board expressed concerns with the Respondent's proposed monitor as Mr. Billiris does not work with the Respondent and cannot provide sufficient supervision. Respondent withdrew his proposed monitor request.

Respondent and monitor must appear at the next scheduled board meeting so the Board can formally approve the Respondent's monitor. Ms. Acuna-Parker has delegation to temporarily approve the monitor.

**MOTION:** After discussion, Dr. Petraglia made a motion to accept the Settlement Agreement. The motion was seconded by Mr. Rust and carried 6/0.

**Tab 2 David Earl Pelton, PT9800, Case No. 2009-19785  
(PCP – Acuna-Parker, Clendenin, Davis)**

Ms. Acuna-Parker was recused to due participation in the Probable Cause Panel.

Respondent was present and sworn in by the court reporter. Jeff Powell, Esq. was also present as the Respondent's counsel.

Ms. Daniels summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was charged with the following violations: **Count I:** Respondent violates Section 486.125(1)(k), F.S. (2009), Section 456.072(1)(z), F.S. (2009), and/or Section 486.125(1)(a), F.S. (2009), by being unable to practice physical therapy with reasonable skill and safety to patients. **Count II:** Respondent violated Section 455.624(1)(w), F.S. (1999) by failing to report to the Board of Physical Therapy in writing that he had entered a plea of nolo contendere to a crime that occurred before July 1, 1999. **Count III:** Respondent violates Section 456.072(1)(w), F.S. (2004), or Section 486.125(1)(k), F.S. (2004), or both, by failing to report to the Board of Physical Therapy in writing that he was convicted or found guilty of, or entered a plea of nolo contendere or guilty to a crime on September 1, 2004. **Count IV:** Respondent violates Section 456.072(1)(w), F.S. (2004), or Section 486.125(1)(k), F.S. (2004), or both, by failing to report to the Board of Physical Therapy in writing that he was convicted or found guilty of, or entered a plea of nolo contendere or guilty to a crime on November 22, 2004. **Count V:** Respondent violates Section 456.072(1)(x), F.S. (2009), or Section 486.125(1)(k), F.S. (2009), or both, by failing to report to the Board of Physical Therapy in writing that he was convicted or found guilty of, or entered a plea of nolo contendere or guilty to a crime on March 27, 2008. **Count VI:** Respondent violates Section 456.072(1)(x), F.S. (2009), or Section 486.125(1)(k), F.S. (2009), or both, by failing to report to the Board of Physical Therapy in writing that he was convicted or found guilty of, or entered a plea of nolo contendere or guilty to a crime on October 15, 2009.

The case was presented as a Settlement Agreement that would impose the following:

- Appearance
- Letter of Concern
- Fine of \$3,000.00 to be paid within three (3) year of the filing of the Final Order.
- Costs of \$4,555.40 to be paid within three (3) year of the filing of the Final Order.
- Compliance with the terms of the monitoring contract with Professionals Resource Network. Confirmation of compliance to be submitted to the Compliance Office within thirty (30) days of the filing if the Final Order.
- Three (3) years probation from the date of the filing of a Final Order accepting and incorporating the Settlement Agreement. Respondent must follow the terms of probation outlined in the Settlement Agreement to include:
  - No home health care
  - Required supervision
  - Respondent may petition the Board for early termination of probation after a period of twelve (12) months.
- Respondent's supervisor must appear before the Board at the meeting at which the Settlement Agreement is heard or the first meeting following commencement of the probation.
- Registration of the Florida laws and rules exam within sixty (60) days of the filing of the Final Order. Successful completion of the Florida laws and rules exam to be completed within twelve (12) months of the filing of the Final

Order.

**MOTION:** After discussion, Mr. Rust rejected the Settlement Agreement and made a motion to offer the Respondent the same terms outlined in the proposed Settlement Agreement with the exception of removing the requirement of a monitor. The motion was seconded by Ms. Baker and carried 6/0.

Respondent agreed to accept the counter agreement.

**Tab 3      Susanne Elizabeth McIntosh, PT5639, Case No. 2010-07208  
(PCP – Acuna-Parker, Clendenin, Davis)**

Ms. Acuna-Parker was recused to due participation in the Probable Cause Panel.

Respondent was not present, nor represented by counsel.

Ms. Daniels summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was charged with violating Section 486.125(1)(a)(1), F.S. (2009) and/or Section 456.072(1)(z), F.S. (2009), by being able to practice physical therapy with reasonable skill and safety to patients by reason of illness or use of alcohol, drugs, narcotics, chemicals, or any other type of material or as a result of any mental or physical condition.

The case was presented as a Settlement Agreement that would impose the following:

- Letter of Concern
- Fine of \$1,500.00 to be paid within one (1) year of the filing of the Final Order.
- Costs in the amount of \$2,329.99 to be paid within one (1) year of the filing of the Final Order.
- Compliance with the terms of the monitoring contract with Professionals Resource Network.
- Appearances before the Board at such times as directed by the Board.
- Three (3) years probation from the date of the filing of a Final Order accepting and incorporating the Settlement Agreement. Respondent must follow the terms of probation outlined in the Settlement Agreement to include:
  - No home health care
  - Required supervision
  - Respondent may petition the Board for early termination of probation after a period of twelve (12) months.
- Respondent's supervisor must appear before the Board at the meeting at which the Settlement Agreement is heard or the first meeting following commencement of the probation.
- Registration of the Florida laws and rules exam within sixty (60) days of the filing of the Final Order. Successful completion of the Florida laws and rules exam to be completed within twelve (12) months of the filing of the Final Order.

Dr. Rivenbark from PRN informed the Board the Respondent withdrew her consent to release information and at this time, PRN has advised Respondent to refrain from practice as she is currently out of compliance with PRN.

The Board was advised by Mr. Lewy to accept the current agreement since the Board is not

aware of Respondent's current compliance.

**MOTION:** After discussion, Mr. Rust made a motion to accept the Settlement Agreement. The motion was seconded by Ms. Baker and carried 6/0.

#### **INFORMAL HEARING NOT INVOLVING DISPUTED ISSUES OF MATERIAL FACT**

**Tab 4 Kesnel Delva, PTA2085, Case No. 2007-18472  
(PCP – Hellman, Candela, Hughes)**

At the request of the Respondent's attorney, this case has been given a continuance to the February 11, 2011 Board meeting per Dr. Hellman, Board Chair.

#### **MOTION FOR DETERMINATION OF WAIVER AND ENTRY OF FINAL ORDER FOLLOWING HEARING**

**Tab 5 John Mulfinger, PT18909, Case No. 2010-03587  
(PCP – Acuna-Parker, Clendenin, Davis)**

Ms. Acuna-Parker was recused due to participation in Probable Cause Panel.

Respondent was not present nor represented by legal counsel.

Ms. Daniels summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was charged with violating Section 486.125(1)(h), by violating a lawful order of the Department or the Board previously entered in a disciplinary hearing.

**MOTION:** Ms. Baker made a motion to find respondent was properly notified of the Administrative Complaint and failed to timely respond thus, making a waiver of his rights to choose or elect the manner in which this case proceeds. The motion was seconded by Dr. Hellman and passed with a 6/0 vote.

**MOTION:** Ms. Baker made a motion to adopt the findings of fact and the conclusions of laws as set forth in the Administrative Complaint. The motion was seconded by Dr. Petraglia and passed with a 6/0 vote.

**MOTION:** Dr. Hellman made a motion to accept into the record and evidence the Department's investigative file inclusive of all documentation provided to the Board through their material as provided as for the purposes of determining penalties. The motion was seconded by Ms. Baker and passed with a 6/0 vote.

**MOTION:** Dr. Petraglia made a motion to find the respondent in violation of Florida Statutes as charged in the Administrative Complaint. The motion was seconded by Ms. Middleton and passed with a 6/0 vote.

Ms. Daniels suggested the following penalties on behalf of the Department:

- Minimum fine of \$5,000 to be paid within sixty (60) days of the filing of the Final Order.
- Costs in the amount of \$774.19 to be paid within sixty (60) days of the filing of the Final Order.
- Passage of the laws and rules examination within sixty (60) days of the filing of the Final Order.

The Board expressed concerns with the life of the Respondent's cases and his continued non-compliance. The disciplinary options available to the Board, including a minimum fine of \$5,000 up to revocation of license, were discussed.

Mr. Kavanagh was present and sworn in by the court reporter.

Dr. Rivenbark addressed the Board to advocate for Mr. Kavanagh's compliance with PRN.

Respondent was charged with the following violations: **Count I:** Respondent violated Section 456.072(1)(v), Florida Statutes (2007), by engaging or attempting to engage in sexual misconduct as defined and prohibited in Section 456.063(1), Florida Statutes (2007). **Count II:** Respondent violated Section 486.125(1)(k), Florida Statutes (2007), by violating any provision of this chapter, chapter 456, or any rules adopted pursuant thereto, through a violation of Section 486.123, Florida Statutes (2007). **Count III:** Respondent violated Section 486.125(1)(e), Florida Statutes (2007), through a violation of Rule 64B17-6.001(2)(d), F.A.C.

Ms. Harding was present and sworn in by the court reporter.

Ms. Harding filed a petition for Rule 64B17-3.001(3)(b) and 64B17 -3.003, Florida Administrative Code.

Ms. Harding applied for licensure on September 24, 2010. She is requesting a waiver from the education requirement as she feels her licensure history in the West Virginia and successful passage of the NPTE in 1995 proves her skill and competency for licensure in Florida. She also holds a transitional Doctor in Physical Therapy degree from the University of St. Augustine and graduated with honors in 2008.

According to the FCCPT, her education is not equivalent to the first professional degree in physical therapy in the United States.

Dr. Hellman expressed her concern with awarding continuing education credit to faculty instructors as they are not furthering their education.

If an applicant fails to pass the examination in three attempts, the applicant shall not be eligible for reexamination unless she or he completes additional educational or training requirements

prescribed by the board. An applicant who has completed the additional educational or training requirements prescribed by the board may take the examination on two more occasions. If the applicant has failed to pass the examination after five attempts, she or he is no longer eligible to take the examination.”

Mr. Protacio has been asked to appear for the Board to reconsider his application for licensure as he has not successfully passed the NPTE exam within 5 attempts and this information was not made available during his initial review.

After discussion, the Board allowed Mr. Protacio to withdraw his application.

Mr. Cox completed all the terms of his order and his conditions were

lifted after his Board appearance on November 10, 2005.

## **APPLICATION FOR RECONSIDERATION**

Ms. Laurel was present and sworn in by the court reporter.

Ms. Laurel has submitted a petition for termination of probation for Case Number 2003-20959, as outlined by her Final Order.

Respondent was charged with the following violations: **Count I:** Respondent was charged with violating Section 486.125(1)(c), Florida Statutes (2006), by pleading guilty to allegation, regardless of adjudication, of a crime in any jurisdiction which directly relates to the practice of physical therapy or to the ability to practice physical therapy. **Count II:** Respondent was further charged with violating Section 486.125(1)(k), Florida Statutes (2006), by violating Section 486.102(2), Florida Statutes (2006), which requires a licensee to be of good moral character to be licensed as a physical therapist.

On September 14, 2007, the Board entered into a Settlement Agreement which included the Respondent to pay a fine of \$5,000, costs, passage of the laws and rule exam within one (1) year and a period of probation for a term of three (3) years.

Ms. Laurel has met all the terms of her probation.

**MOTION:** After discussion, Dr. Hellman made a motion to terminate Ms. Laurel's probation. The motion was seconded by Ms. Baker and carried 6/0.
