Licensure by Limited License Psychologist

The Board of Psychology is responsible for licensing and regulating psychologists, provisional psychologists and limited license psychologists in Florida.

Licensure Methods

Non-Remunerated: Volunteer who is not paid for services.

- Total Due: \$5.00
- Requires Fee Waiver Affidavit: <http://www.doh.state.fl.us/mqa/psychology/PYllfeefrm.pdf>

Remunerated: Paid employee; total due: \$30.00

Licensure Requirements

The following criteria must be met to become a limited license psychologist in Florida:

- The applicant was licensed to practice psychology in any jurisdiction in the United States for at least 10 years.
- The applicant is retired or will retire from the active practice of psychology within six (6) months of the date of the application.

The limited licensee can only practice in the employ of public agencies or institutions or nonprofit agencies or institutions which meet the requirements of s. 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, and which provide professional liability coverage for acts or omissions of the limited licensee.

Limited licensees may provide services only to the indigent, underserved, or critical need populations within the state.

The application package at http://www.doh.state.fl.us/mqa/psychology/psy_lic_req.html contains additional information regarding the application, the fees, other required documentation, and special testing accommodations due to ADA or religious conflict issues and examination information.

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Application Deadlines

Section 120.60, Florida Statutes, states an agency is allowed 30 days from receipt of the application and fee to review an application and notify the applicant in writing of any deficiencies. If notification of application status has not been received within 40 days of the Department's receipt of the application, you may contact the board's administrative office. It is recommended that all applicants submit applications and documentation as far in advance of deadlines as possible. Every application for a license shall be approved or denied within 90 days after receipt of a completed application.

To ensure that your application is reviewed at the next available board meeting, it must be complete 30 days prior to that board meeting.
