## **MOTION FOR BOARD'S FINAL ORDER AFTER HEARING NOT INVOLVING DISPUTED ISSUES OF MATERIAL FACT**

**TAB 1** Deborah Lee Hadden, R.R.T., DOH Case No: 2010-10191  
Informal Hearing, (PCP Members – Nunez, Sherrod)

Mr. Fields asked to be recused due to a conflict of interest with the Respondent.

Respondent was not present nor represent by counsel.

Ms. Smith summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was charged with the following violation: Section 456.072(1)(q), Florida Statutes (2009) by violating a lawful order of the department or the board.

The case was presented as a Hearing Not Involving Disputed Issues of Material Fact, which requires the Board to impose whatever discipline upon the Respondent's license that the Board deems appropriated and to assess costs of the investigation.

**TAB 4** Sheila Jean Schwager, C.R.T., DOH Case No: 2010-00380  
Settlement Agreement, (PCP Members –Nunez, Sherrod)

Respondent was present and sworn in by the court reporter. She was represented by David Spicer, Esquire.

Ms. Smith summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was charged with the following violations: **Count 1)** Section 468.365 (1)(v), Florida Statutes (2008, 2009), by performing professional services which have not been duly ordered by a physician licensed pursuant to chapter 458 or chapter 459 and which are not in accordance with protocols established by the hospital, other care provider, or the board, except as provided in ss. 743.064, 766.13, and 768.13. **Count 2)** Section 468.365 (1)(t) Florida Statutes (2008, 2009), by failing to keep written respiratory care records justifying the reason for the action taken by the licensee. **Count 3)** Section 456.072(1)(o), Florida Statutes (2008, 2009), by practicing or offering to practice beyond the scope permitted by law or accepting and performing professional responsibilities the licensee knows, or has reason to know, the licensee is not competent to perform.

The case was presented as a Settlement Agreement that would impose the following penalties:

- Reprimand
- \$600.00 fine to be paid within two (2) years of the filing of the Final Order by cashiers check or money order
- Costs in the amount of \$1,164.69 to be paid within two (2) years of the filing of the Final Order by cashiers check or money order

**TAB 6** Scott William Arthur, R.R.T., DOH Case No: 2010-10216  
Informal Waiver/Default, (PCP Members – Nunez, Sherrod)

Respondent was not present nor represented by counsel.

Ms. Smith summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was charged with the following violation: Section 456.072 (1)(hh), Florida Statutes (2009), by being terminated from a treatment program for impaired practitioners, which is overseen by an impaired practitioner consultant as described in s. 456.076, for failure to comply, without good cause, with the terms of the monitoring or treatment contract entered into by the licensee, or for not successfully completing any drug treatment or alcohol treatment program.

The case was originally presented as a Hearing Not Involving Disputed Issues of Material Facts and determination of Respondent’s waiver of right to request a formal hearing by default; however, Mr. Arthur signed and submitted a request to Voluntary Relinquishment Just prior to the Board meeting.

Respondent was not present nor represented by counsel. Mr. Barrett was recused from this case due to participation in the Probable Cause Panel.

Dr. Rivenbark addressed the Board and stated Mr. Clark appears to be in recovery as he has been compliant with drug screens and has been attending his weekly monitored PRN groups. PRN advocates in his favor and recommended lifting suspension, if he would not work in a home health setting.

After discussion, Ms. Sherrod made a motion to amend the Final Order for DOH Case No. 2005-51223, to allow partial payments with a minimum payment of \$50 each month, by cashiers check or money order, with outstanding amount of \$6,428.00 due within 36 months of the date of the Final Order. Suspension is lifted contingent upon submitting proof of 24 continuing education (CE) hours for the 2009-2011 biennium. CE's must be submitted on or before May 31, 2011. Board staff may assess compliance and lift suspension. License will be placed on probation for two (2) years and must remain compliant with PRN; can only work in a hospital setting and supervisor must submit quarterly reports.

Option 1: Applicants will be permitted to withdraw the application, and, consequently, the application will not be presented to the Board for individual consideration and final action. The applicant will not have a denial of record on file if a withdrawal is requested.

Option 2: Applications will be prepared for individual consideration by the Board, whether a withdrawal has been requested or not. The Board would have the opportunity to review the individual history, and, unless facts are found to be other than presented, the Board would be required to deny the licensure application or consider a request for withdrawal if the applicant was present. If denied, a Notice of Intent to Deny would be issued, which would still provide a limited timeframe for the applicant to withdraw or otherwise have the denial become a permanent part of their application record.

The Board chose option 1: staff will give them the option to withdraw and if they withdraw, the application does not need to come before the Board.
