Due to participation in the Probable Cause Panel, Ms. Sherrod was recused from Tab 1-11, 14-19 and 22-24. Dr. Friday-Stroud was directed to Chair said Tabs.

MOTION FOR BOARD'S FINAL ORDER AFTER HEARING NOT INVOLVING DISPUTED ISSUES OF MATERIAL FACT

TAB 1 Robin Gail Smith, C.R.T., DOH Case No: 2010-13372
Informal Hearing, (PCP Members – Nunez, Sherrod, Fields)

Respondent was not present nor represented by Counsel.

Ms. Cowan summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was charged with the following violation: Section 456.072(1)(q), Florida Statutes (2009) by violating a lawful order of the department or the board.

The case was presented as a Hearing Not Involving Disputed Issues of Material Fact, which requires the Board to impose whatever discipline upon the Respondent's license that the Board deems appropriated and to assess costs of the investigation.

MOTION: Mr. Barrett made a motion to accept the investigative report into evidence for the purpose of imposing penalties. The motion was seconded by Mr. Hendriksen and carried 4/0.

MOTION: Dr. Friday-Stroud made a motion to make a finding that the Respondent was properly served and has requested an informal hearing. The motion was seconded by Mr. Barrett and carried 4/0.

MOTION: Dr. Friday-Stroud made a motion to adopt the findings of fact as set forth in the Administrative Complaint. The motion was seconded by Mr. Hendriksen and carried 4/0.

MOTION: After discussion, Mr. Hendriksen made a motion to impose the following penalties:

- Reprimand
- Costs to be paid within eighteen (18) months of the filing of the Final Order
- \$300.00 fine to be paid within eighteen (18) months of the filing of the Final Order
- License shall be suspended until payment of fines and costs are met in Case # 2010-03474. During the period of suspension, Respondent shall in no way participate in the delivery of respiratory care services

The motion was seconded by Dr. Friday-Stroud and carried 4/0.

MOTION: Mr. Barrett made a motion to assess the costs of \$298.77 to be paid within eighteen (18) months of the filing of the Final Order. The motion was seconded by Mr. Hendriksen and carried 4/0.

TAB 2 Mary M. Jackson, R.P.C.C., DOH Case No: 2010-06704
Settlement Agreement, (PCP Members –Nunez, Sherrod)

Respondent was not presented nor represented by Counsel.

Ms. Cowan summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was charged with the following violation: Section 468.365 (1)(x), Florida Statutes (2009), by violating any provision of this chapter or chapter 456 Or any rules adopted pursuant thereto. During each biennium, as established by the Department, each licensee must earn 24 contact hours of continuing education.

The case was presented as a Settlement Agreement that would impose the following penalties:

- Reprimand
- Costs to be paid within two (2) years of the filing of the Final Order
- License is suspended indefinitely; however, the suspension is stayed for sixty (60) days
- Respondent must submit proof of continuing education hours within sixty (60) days otherwise the suspension will be imposed

MOTION: Mr. Barrett made a motion to accept the Settlement Agreement. The motion was seconded by Mr. Hendriksen and carried 4/0.

MOTION: Mr. Killion made a motion to assess costs of \$634.91 to be paid within two (2) years of the filing of the Final Order. The motion was seconded by Dr. Friday-Stroud and carried 4/0.

TAB 3 Michael K. Williams, C.R.T., DOH Case No: 2010-00383
Settlement Agreement, (PCP Members –Nunez, Sherrod)

Respondent was present and sworn in by the court reporter. He was represented by Mr. Kenneth Deacon, Esquire.

Ms. Cowan summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was charged with the following violations: **Count 1)** Section 468.365 (1)(v), Florida Statutes (2008, 2009), by performing professional services which have not been duly ordered by a physician licensed pursuant to chapter 458 or chapter 459 and which are not in accordance with protocols established by the hospital, other care provider, or the board, except as provided in ss. 743.064, 766.13, and 768.13. **Count 2)** Section 468.365 (1)(t) Florida Statutes (2008, 2009), by failing to keep written respiratory care records justifying the reason for the action taken by the licensee. **Count 3)** Section 456.072(1)(o), Florida Statutes (2008, 2009), by practicing or offering to practice beyond the scope permitted by law or accepting and performing professional responsibilities the licensee knows, or has reason to know, the licensee is not competent to perform.

The case was presented as a Settlement Agreement that would impose the following penalties:

- Reprimand
- \$300.00 fine to be paid within three (3) years of the filing of the Final Order
- Costs of \$1,888.19 to be paid within three (3) years of the filing of the Final Order
- Within one (1) years, complete continuing education courses of two (2) hours in Critical Thinking and two (2) hours in Accurate and Legal Documentation, Patient Rights and Responsibilities, and Ethics.

MOTION: Dr. Friday-Stroud made a motion to accept the Settlement Agreement. The motion was seconded Mr. Barrett by and carried 4/0.

TAB 4 Candice R. Maltezos, C.R.T., DOH Case No: 2010-22102
Settlement Agreement, (PCP Members –Nunez, Sherrod)

Respondent was not present nor represent by Counsel. Dr. Brown was present to speak on behalf of PRN.

Ms. Cowan summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was charged with the following violation: Section 456.072(1)(aa), Florida Statutes (2010), for testing positive for any drug, as defined in Section 112.0455, on any confirmed pre-employment or employer-ordered drug screening when the practitioner does not have a lawful prescription and legitimate medical reason for using such drug.

The case was presented as a Settlement Agreement that would impose the following penalties:

- Reprimand
- \$500.00 fine to be paid within four (4) years of the filing of the Final Order
- Costs to be paid within four (4) years of the filing of the Final Order
- License shall be suspended until such time as Respondent petitions and appears before the Board and proves that she is safe to practice. Proof of competence to return to the practice of respiratory care shall include, at a minimum, an evaluation by the Professional Resources Network (PRN). During the period of suspension, Respondent shall in no way participate in the delivery of respiratory care services.

MOTION: Dr. Friday-Stroud made a motion to accept the Settlement Agreement. The motion was seconded by Mr. Killion and carried 3/1.

MOTION: Mr. Killion made a motion to assess costs of \$3,222.86 to be paid within four (4) years of the filing of the Final Order. The motion was seconded by Dr. Friday-Stroud and carried 3/1.

Dr. Brown reported, Ms. Maltezos has been evaluated and signed a one year contract with the Professional Resource Network (PRN). PRN feels Ms. Maltezos has proven competence and is ready to return to the practice of respiratory care, therefore, they are advocating for the suspension to be lifted should the Board so choose.

MOTION: Dr. Friday-Stroud made a motion to reinstate Respondent's license. The motion was seconded by Mr. Hendriksen and carried 3/1.

TAB 5 Vicki L. Elliott, C.R.T., Settlement Agreement, 2010-21053
Settlement Agreement, (PCP Members –Nunez, Sherrod)

Respondent was not present nor represented by Counsel.

Ms. Cowan summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was charged with the following violations: **Count 1**) Section 468.365 (1)(w), Florida Statutes, by being unable to deliver respiratory care service with reasonable skill and safely to patients by reason of illness or use of alcohol, drugs, narcotics, chemicals, or any other type of material as a result of any mental or physical condition. **Count 2**) Section 456.072(1)(x), Florida Statutes (2007) by failing to report to the board, or the department if there is no board, in writing within 30 days after the licensee has been convicted or found guilty of , or entered a plea of nolo contendere to, regardless of adjudication, a crime in any jurisdiction.

The case was presented as a Settlement Agreement that would impose the following penalties:

- Reprimand
- \$300.00 fine to be paid within seven (7) years of the filing of the Final Order
- Costs to be paid within seven (7) years of the filing of the Final Order

- License shall be suspended until such time as Respondent petitions and appears before therefore and proves that she is safe to practice. Proof of competence to return to the practice of respiratory care shall include, at a minimum, an evaluation by the Professional Resources Network (PRN). During the period of suspension, Respondent shall in no way participate in the delivery of respiratory care services.

MOTION: Mr. Killion made a motion to accept the Settlement Agreement. The motion was seconded by Mr. Hendriksen and carried 3/1.

MOTION: Dr. Friday-Stroud made a motion to assess costs of \$6,453.13 to be paid within seven (7) years of the filing of the Final Order. The motion was seconded by Mr. Killion and carried 4/0.

Respondent was charged with the following violations: **Count 1)** Section 468.365(1)(v), Florida Statutes (2008, 2009), by performing professional services which have not been duly ordered by a physician licensed pursuant to chapter 458 or chapter 459 and which are not in accordance with protocols established by the hospital, other care provider, or the board, except as provided in ss. 743.064, 766.13, and 768.13. **Count 2)** Section 468.365(1)(t) Florida Statutes (2008, 2009), by failing to keep written respiratory care records justifying the reason for the action taken by the licensee. **Count 3)** Section 456.072(1)(o), Florida Statutes (2008, 2009), by practicing or offering to practice beyond the scope permitted by

 - Respondent shall submit written report of each current employer, whether employed as a respiratory therapist or not, every three (3) months
 - All current and future settings in which the Respondent practices respiratory care shall be promptly informed of the respondent's probationary status
 - Reports must describe the Respondent's work assignment, workload, level of performance shall constitute a violation of this probation
 - Term of probation shall begin on the date that the Final Order is issued

MOTION: Dr. Friday-Stroud made a motion to assess costs of \$1,551.17 to be paid within three (3) years of the filing of the Final Order. The motion was seconded by Mr. Hendriksen and carried 4/0.

TAB 8 Tiffany L. Secki, C.R.T., Settlement Agreement, 2010-01358
Settlement Agreement, (PCP Members –Nunez, Sherrod)

Respondent was present and sworn in by the court reporter.

Ms. Cowan summarized the case for the Board. - License shall be suspended until all terms of previous Final Order in Case Number 2009-23793 are complied with. During the period of suspension, Respondent shall in no way participate in the delivery of respiratory care services.

- Reprimand
- \$500.00 fine to be paid within two (2) years of the filing of the Final Order

Proof of competence shall include, at a minimum, an evaluation by the Professionals Resource Network (PRN). PETITION FOR DECLARATORY STATEMENT

TAB 41 John Wilgis, M.B.A., RRT, On Behalf of the Florida Society for Respiratory Care

Mr. Wilgis was present and sworn in by the court reporter. Mr. Willerth and Ms. Barrett were present before the Board as well. Tabs 41 and tab 42 was addressed at the same time.

Mr. Wilgis submitted a Petition for Declaratory Statement requesting the Board's opinion as to whether or not respiratory therapist can legally accept orders from an Advanced Registered Nurse Practitioner (ARNP) or a Physician Assistant (PA). If so, do the orders need to state "verbal" or "telephone" and/or be signed off by the physician according to hospital policy? Mr. Wilgis further asks if a respiratory therapist carries out an order by an ARNP or PA, are they in violation of the practice act?

TAB 42 Sheryle A. Barrett, B.A., RRT, President of the Florida Society for Respiratory Care

Ms. Barrett submitted a Petition for Declaratory Statement requesting clarification from the Board as to licensee's maintaining credentials by the National Board of Respiratory Care.

If respiratory therapists are not required to maintain their credentials, what credential designations can a licensed CRT or RRT use?

Scott Sinagallio was allowed to address the Board regarding this issue.

MOTION: After discussion, Ms. Sherrod made a motion to deny the Declaratory Statements in tabs 41 and 42 as the petitions were not legally sufficient. The motion was seconded by Dr Friday-Stroud and carried 5/0.

TAB 56 CE credits for CRT's becoming RRT's

Board staff is frequently asked if a Certified Respiratory Therapist (CRT) relinquishes their license to become licensed as a Registered Respiratory Therapist (RRT), can they use the continuing education courses they completed under their CRT license towards their RRT renewal?

Currently, there is no clear rule that states one way or the other. Staff requested the Board's opinion and consider possible rule making to address this question.

The Board agreed that it is fair for CRT's to use their continuing education credits for their new RRT license.

Motion: After discussion, Dr. Friday-Stroud made a motion to open Rule 64B32-6.001, F.A.C., for development and directed Counsel to draft language. The motion was seconded by Ms. Sherrod and carried 5/0.

6. Practice Employment - changing “medically related employment” to “**respiratory care employment**” Also changing the rule reference from 64B32-2.001(2)2.(d) to **64B32-2.001(3)(d)**

The Note after 7. and before 8. – adding “**If you answer “No” to A.1., B.1., or C.1. please respond “N/A” for A.2., B.2., C.2. and C.3**”

8. Criminal History – changing “If no do not answer A.2.”, etc. to “If no, please respond N/A to A.2.”, etc. Also adding the N/A check box to the appropriate questions.

9. Disciplinary History – changing “had a license revoked” to “**had a professional healthcare license revoked**”

10. Mandatory Continuing Education Requirement – adding blanks for the course provider name, number, title, and date completed.

TAB 51 HB 155 Privacy of Firearm Owners

This Legislation prohibits a licensed health care practitioner or licensed health care facility from intentionally entering any disclosed information concerning firearm ownership into a patient's health record if the information is not relevant to the patient's medical care or safety, or the safety of others. Additionally, licensed health care providers and health care facilities are:

- prohibited from inquiring whether oral or written, about the ownership of firearms or ammunition unless the information is relevant to the patient's medical care or safety, or the safety of others;
- prohibited from discriminating against a patient based upon whether a patient exercises his or her constitutional right to own and possess firearms or ammunition; and
- mandated to respect a patient's right to own or possess a firearm and refrain from harassing a patient about firearm ownership during an examination.

MOTION: After discussion, Ms. Sherrod made a motion to find that this new law falls under "failure to comply with a legal obligation", therefore, the current disciplinary guideline rule applies. The motion was seconded by Dr. Friday-Stroud and carried 5/0.

TAB 52 Jim King Keep Florida Working Act

The Legislature passed and the Governor signed SB 146 the "Jim King Keep Florida Working Act" amending s. 112.011, F.S. Among other provisions, the law requires the Department to submit a report by December 31, 2011 and every four years thereafter listing all laws or rules "**that disqualify from employment or licensure persons who have been convicted of a crime and have completed any incarceration and restitution to which they have been sentenced for such crime**".

The Department is requesting each Board conduct a review of their laws and rules to determine if any provisions exist that would automatically disqualify an applicant. It is not necessary to reference 456.0635 (SB 1986) as the Department will take note of this.

Each Board is being asked to put on the record a vote that indicates the outcome of the review.

MOTION: After discussion, Ms. Sherrod made a motion that the Board of Respiratory Care does not have any laws or rules that would disqualify persons with prior convictions from employment or licensure. The motion was seconded by Mr. Barrett and carried 5/0.
